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ARABIC COLLECTION

In this issue of Research Review we publish short descriptions of a further forty manuscripts from the IASAR collection. Four hundred and forty manuscripts have been accessioned as at March 1964.

The work of collection is still being carried out mainly by al-Hajj ^cUthmān b. Ishaq Boyo, but greater emphasis is now placed upon the recovery of material of direct importance for the history of West Africa. The first four hundred manuscripts, by contrast, were collected at random, and therefore form a representative sample of works in Arabic script owned by the malams of Ghana. All items are in xerox copy.

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
