



# Irem Temple Country Club Kris Pries, Golf Course Superintendent

October brings us to yet another Tillinghast course. This time, Irem Temple will be hosting our monthly meeting and annual election. Tillinghast originally designed this course as a 27-hole facility. Around 1936 or so, the course was changed to its current 18-hole layout. The Par 72, 6654 yard track has many greens that say Tillinghast. Kris Pries and his staff should have the place in wonderful condition.

Kris Pries, Golf Course Superintendent is a 2003 Rutgers University graduate. Kris had previously worked at Fox Hill from 1996 until taking the reins at Irem Country Club in 2003. Kris began on the crew, grew to Assistant Superintendent, and decided to pursue a career in turf management through the Rutgers Program.

John Potera, Assistant Superintendent, is in his second year at Rutgers and has been with Kris since 2003. John and Kris have a year round staff of 5 and swell to 12 crew members during peak season. The course sits among 550 acres in Dallas, PA that belong to the Shriners.

During the next few months a new driving range will be started. Incorporated with that project will be the construction of a new maintenance facility. Kris hopes to have a much larger structure than he currently has, along with all the accourtements of the newer facilities in the area. Projects that have already been done are renovations to bunkers on the 15th and 18th holes and, by the time we play, renovation work should be started on the 14th hole bunkers.



# The Three "R's" Recovery, Replenish and Return

Recovery begins with a plan. For example, aerate to open the soil and remove thatch that for many caused serious problems this season. Introduce as much topdressing sand as possible to ensure air exhange is encouraged and drainage is promoted. In other words, return to the basics of turfgrass management! Any recovery plan should focus on a strong agronomic foundation before using fine tuning techniaues.

Fertilze in a controlled manner. All too often fertilizer is applied in the fall to promote the most rapid recovery possible. Don't compromise natural growth. Rather, support it so that growth proceed above and below soil level. Excess fertilization in the fall will promote excess topgrowth at the expense of root growth.

Also, lush turf is much more susceptible to disease, particularly pink snow mold (Microdochium

patch). When it comes to fertilizing for recovery, take the "steady as she goes" approach. It will pay off over the long term.

We are now beginning to see grub damage in bordering rough. Foraging animals and even flocks of turkeys are searching for this food source. Site specific treatment to control grub activity may be necessary this fall. However, chart and map the current areas of damage so treatments can be scheduled and implemented next year when the maximum control can be achieved.

Questions and concerns about gray leaf spot have been fairly steady this fall. Diagnostic labs have confirmed many severe outbreaks this season. Explore all options when recovery programs are developed. The use of turf-type tall fescue and dwarf turf-type fescue has become much more aggressively practiced. The turf-type tall fescues are classified as drought avoidant due to their deep, extensive root structures. To date there are no confirmed cases of gray leaf spot on turftype tall fescue in the Mid-Atlantic Region.
