Brief History of W. R. C. No. 5, Dep't Ill.



Alfred Harrison Woman's Relief Corps No. 5, Auxiliary to Alfred Harrison Post No. 152, Dep't Ill. G. A. R., was instituted January 18th, 1884, by Post Commander John W. Leaverton, acting as Installing Officer, under the authority of Mrs. E. Florence Barker, National President, and Sarah E. Fuller, National Secretary, W. R. C., with 43 charter members, of which sixteen were present at time of instituoion. Charter remained open four weeks to receive charter members. (Rules and Regulations gave that permission at that time.) Post No. 152, having previously decided to have an auxiliary, voted \$19.42 to purchase the Corps charter and supplies. Within a year after the Corps was organized it paid back this money to Post and much more, gave the Post a handsome silk flag and a life size crayon picture of Alfred Harrison, for whom the Post is named, a soldier of Gen. Grant's regiment (21st Ill.), who was killed at the battle of "Stone River."

Corps No. 5 has always responded to every call for help, and has never failed to assist the Post when called upon, or give to the needy Union soldier, his widow and orphans. The records on hand give an account of \$700 expended for relief and turned over to Post. This amount does not include all "other than money," etc.

Alfred Harrison Corps (and Post) had the misfortune to be burned out on Sept. 24, 1887, and lost all, including a Mason & Hamlin Organ presented by the Post, also many valuable papers, relics and pictures.

This Corps has been honored by the Department of Illinois by having one of its members (Mrs. Leaverton) chosen for two consecutive years to fill the position of Department President; also, two of its members (Freeman and Leaverton) elected as Dep't S. V. P.; one of its members (Mattie Lindsey) served as Dep't Secretary for two years; three of its members (Leaverton, Lindsey and Freeman) were elected on Dep't Executive Board; one of its members (Leaverton) was appointed as Dep't Counsellor for two years—1887 and 1892—and a delegate to National Convention has been chosen twice from this Corps.

Corps No. 5 has always felt it a duty that each Corps send a representative to the Annual Department Convention, hence have always sent a delegate and paid her expenses.

The Corps adopted printed arrearage notices in 1885, which read as follows:

By-Laws,

Adopted February 23d, 1884, by Alfred Harrison W. R. C. No. 5, Dep't of Ill., Auxiliary to Post No. 152, G. A. R.

SECTION 1. The regular meetings of this Corps shall be held the second and fourth Saturdays of each month at 2 p. m.

SEC. 2. The dues from each member of this Corps shall be twenty-five cents per quarter, payable in advance; the quarters to begin with the first meetings in January, April, July and October.

SEC. 3. The admission fee on Transfer Card shall be One Dollar.

SEC. 4. No money shall be voted or disposed of at a special meeting.

SEC. 5. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except that stated in the call.

SEC. 6. Cushing's Manual shall be the authority of Parliamentary practice of this Corps,

SEC. 7. All moneys specially applied for use of committees, for payment of claims, purchase of Corps supplies, or any other purpose, must receive a two-thirds vote of the members present.

SEC. 8. Any officer of this Corps who shall absent herself for three consecutive meetings without presenting an excuse shall be considered out of her office. The vacancy shall be filled by vote of the Corps at next regular meeting.

SEC. 9. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of all the members present.

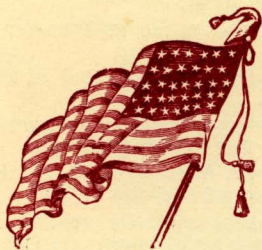
