## PREFACE.

**W**HEN "Mac" first began his Cartoons for the "Cape Times," I was made the target for a good deal of anonymous abuse. Some of these criticisms were perhaps not wholly unjustified, for "Mac" had not yet got a firm hold of his pencil; others were merely malignant; all were consigned to the waste paper basket, and the young Cartoonist was given a fair chance. The wisdom or unwisdom of that decision may be judged from the collection of Sketches in the present volume—a selection from several hundreds of Cartoons, Caricatures, Parliamentary Illustrations and Humorous Portraits—and I think "Mac" need not fear to leave the result to the discernment of a sympathetic public. The work is uneven—what artist's is not?—but it is the work of an honest craftsman, free from all affectation and pretence, with a sincere love of his craft, a genial outlook upon the drolleries of men and things, and powers of expression and characterisation in black and white which he is every month turning to better account.
