Some of our members are taking the Turf Management Correspondence Course sponsored by the University of Guelph. For the younger superintendent without diploma or degree, this course is a


'must' and the year's study can be completed September thro' March. The course duration is three years, at the end of which each successful student is awarded the Ontario Diploma in Horticulture.
