PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

"Look Back Over The Year"

In keeping with the concept expressed in the phrase "time flies", I wonder how the past year passed so quickly. It has been quite an eventful year, both as individual Superintendents and/or as an Association.

The most unique characteristic of this year's growing season was again unusual climatological conditions. The first three months were above average in rainfall totals.
