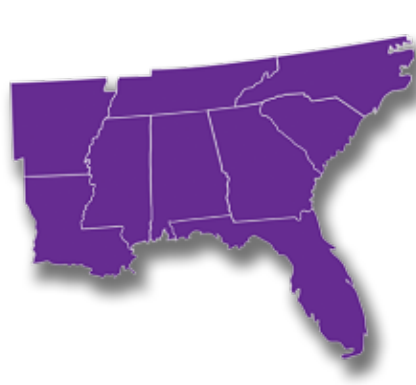

Northeast Region
