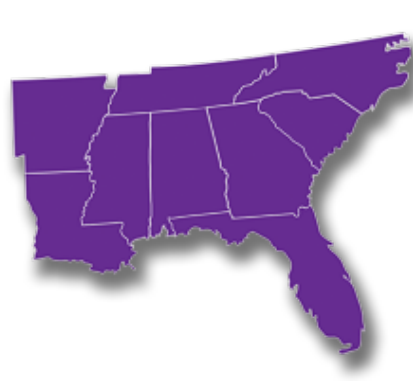

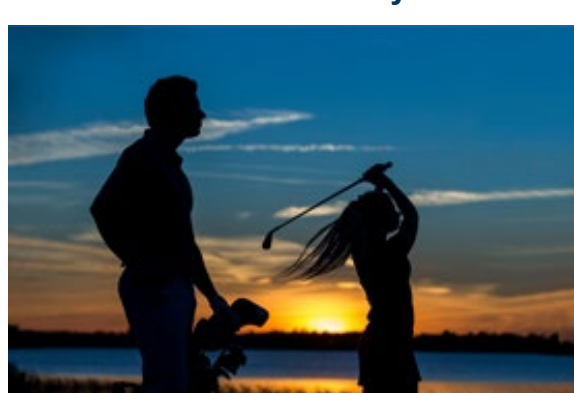


How To Sample For Winter Injury On Putting Greens

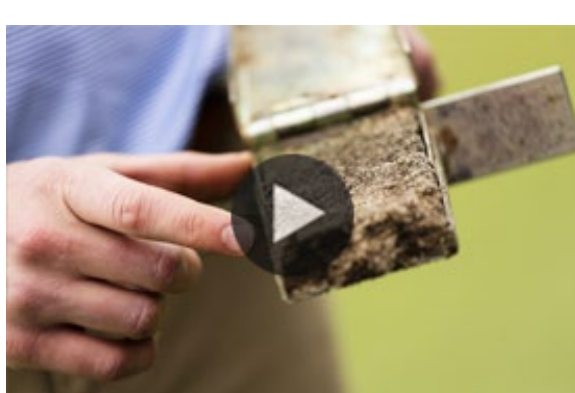
