Golf course superintendents often are asked what they do during winter. For some courses, what they don't do could be even more important.

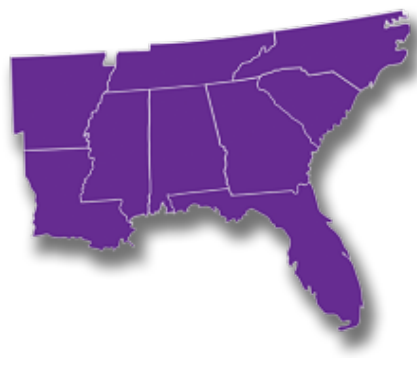
