With fewer employees and reduced budgets at many courses, prioritizing plant health applications is critical to maintain healthy turf through the uncertainties ahead.

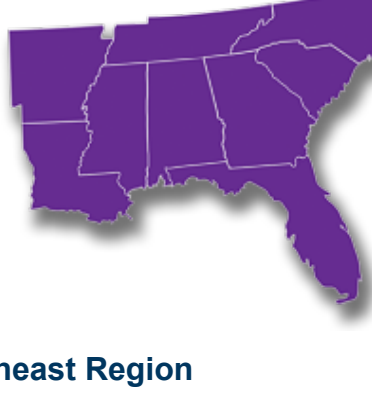

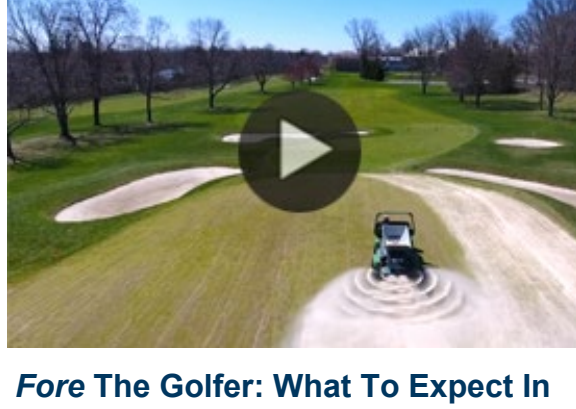

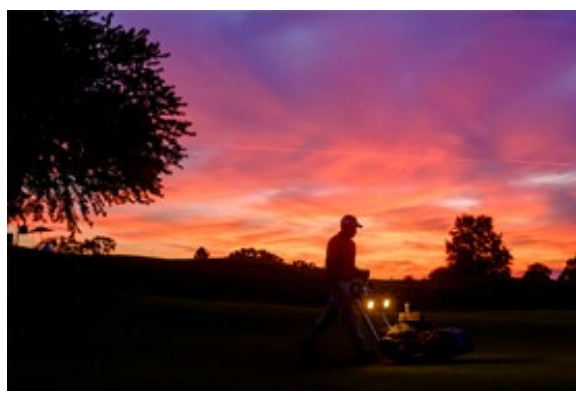
