Although bunker rakes have been removed from golf courses, we should still try to leave the course as we found it – especially when entering and exiting a bunker.

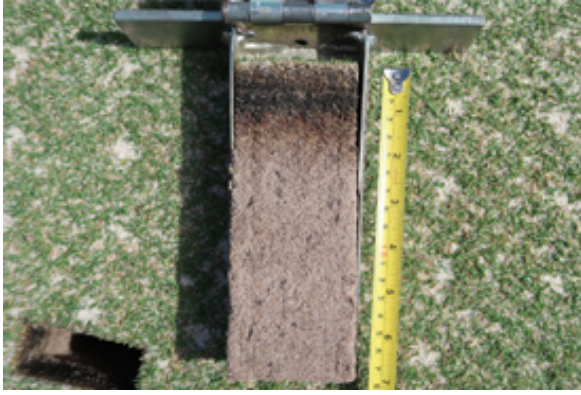
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Southeast Region

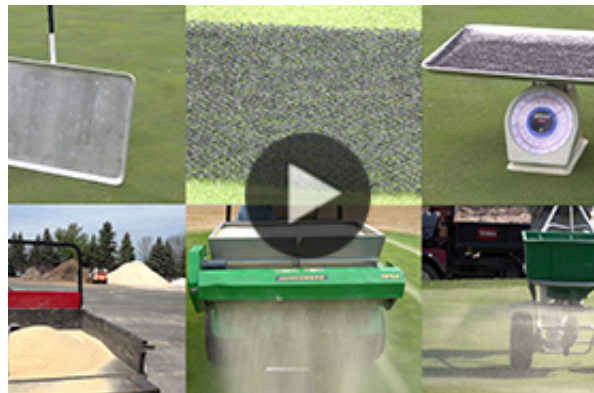
