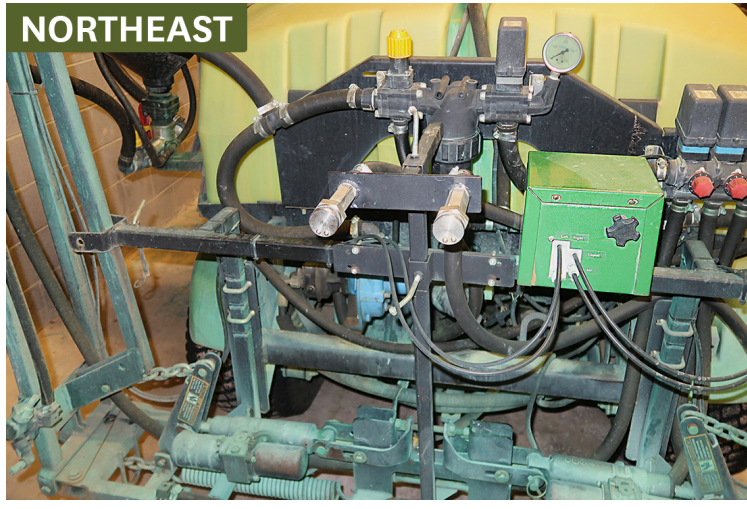

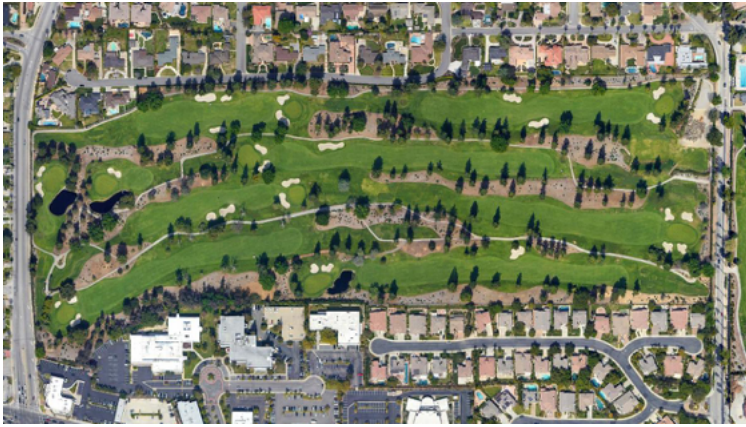


What I'd Do Differently

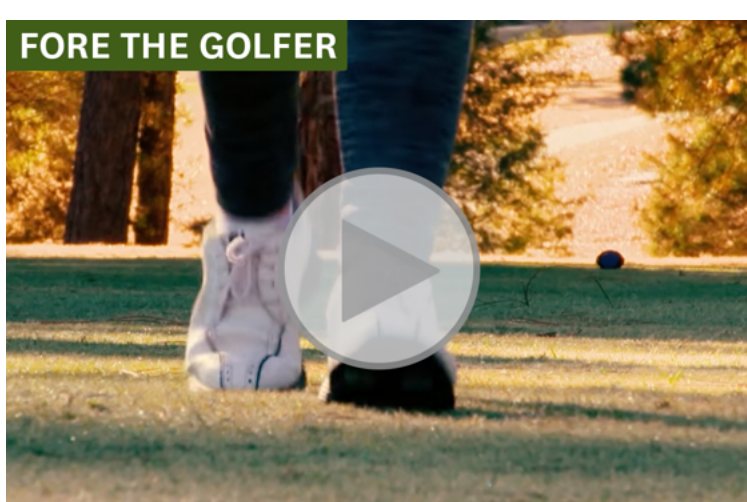


Sampling for Winter Injury on Putting Greens
