Don't discount the role that roots play in providing good putting surfaces. This year, commit to several simple practices that can encourage a healthier root system.

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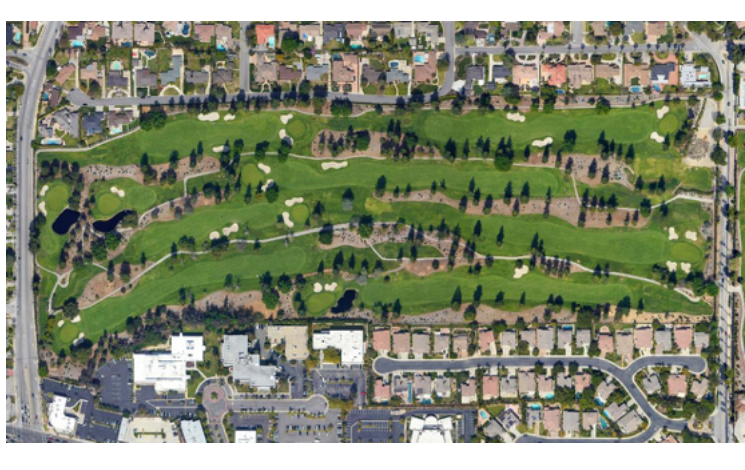
In Case You Missed It
