





## NEWS SUMMARY.

**Washington.**  
During the month of October, four calls for the deduction of \$20 bonds matured, amounting to \$40,000,000. The amount received was \$35,000,000, which is given as \$35,000,000. This includes scattering debts of other calls that had not previously come in. This amount, together with the coin held by the Treasury by the date of \$35,000,000, or 2 per cent, holds is the public debt statement dated issued. It is expected the debt statement will show a reduction of about \$4,000,000.

**Chicago.**
