

Nettie's Diary

Tuesday, February 24, 1880

haven't done any thing but to help Elva make a switch. Rained so we could not go to Ortonville to church tonight. They are holding meetings, 18 have started. This is the 3^d week.

Wednesday 25

Rained some all day because Rena Case was married. Wilber came after me. I got quite wet coming home. Aunt Martha has been married nine years last Sunday, 22nd February. Ma has been married 23 years - 19 ".

Thursday 26

Day pleasant. I heard a spring bird sing. I have been baking a good share of the day. Wilber has a hard cold. Grandpa has a cold. The frost is all out of the ground.

Friday 27

This morning I heard a robin sing. Went to Mrs. Austin with Mr. Bird. She is sick. I have been to work all day and to night I am very tired & wish that I was to home.

Saturday, February 28, 1880

This morning Mrs. Austin is better. Mrs. Sletter has been here to night Uncle Horace's folks came I'm as tired as can be & have wished every hour in the day that I was home.

Sunday 29

This is the last time I ever saw Grandpa.

Uncle Horace brought me home this morning. Glad to get home. Lottie and All came down & we sang some in the evening we walked to O H to church. A good sermon we heard & may I profit by it.

Monday, March 1, 1880

This morning I came back to Mrs. Austin's. Have worked today & to night I am tired. I hope I may be better than I have been before. As I commence this month may it be one of good.

Tuesday 2

Mrs. Austin has sat up to day & yesterday for the first. I have ironed & moped & made pies (& and a lots.) I have enjoyed myself very much to day. I wish I was home to night.

Wednesday, March 3, 880

I came home from Mrs Austin & when I got home Grandpa was dying about 1 o'clock Sothe helped him from the chair to the lounge & he said, how many stripes there is in the carpet from here to the lounge. That is the last he said at 2 his eyes were shut.

Thursday 4

Yesterday after they helped Grandpa on the lounge Grandma asked him if he rested & he said yes I am resting this is the first. Today I have washed & baked some. ma & Pa has gone to Clarkston.

Friday 5

It rained some last night. Today the wind blows & tis cold. Pa has gon to the station Uncle Horace & Uncle Curtis come. Tis a sad house upto the other house.

Saturday 6

This morning we go to the grave with our love one he looks as if he was resting Elder Gagne preached. Elder Weston wait there the house was filled the text Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord.

Sunday, March 7, 1880

Uncle wants to go to Aunt Martha's to day & all & Lottie & I went. We had a good time (it did not seem like Sunday) Uncle Horace was full of fun he wanted me to go home with him.

Monday 8

Today I went and helped Lottie wash she had a large washing to do. I am tired to night. Will Nethling is to work here Grandma staid here last night. I have some cold.

Tuesday 9

The men are flocking jetzt to Mr. La Flamboy's sale. He expected Aunt Martha here today but she did not come. Grandma & Lottie has been down here & all came down to supper day pleasant

Wednesday 10

Pleasant today. Ma & I have done a large wash Pa & Will & Wilber are down on the plantation ditching. This afternoon Ma has been up to Grandmas she is quite well now.

Thursday, March 11, 1885

I have done part of my ironing to day. Sarah and family came and I had to put it away. I had a good visit with them. Snowed some this morning but it all went off that day.

Friday 12

This forenoon I went down to Uncle Williams with Wilber, to help Jennie get dinner. I came home with Pa + Will, Jennie and I saw them ditch.

Saturday 13

I finished my ironing this forenoon. This afternoon I went up to Grandmas. Mrs. Hulda Bird came there in the evening Janie + Luke came there. Yesterday I got a letter from Uncle Curtis.

Sunday 14

Not very cold to day. We all went to Chilomville to Sunday S. + Church in the afternoon + then we went to Adwins + Ettha got supper for us. We heard a good sermon in James 1st 6 last verse.

Monday, March 15, 1880

This morning the spring birds are singing.
Ma + I have washed and this afternoon
Lottie + Grandma + ma + I went to Eli
Bird had a good visit. Came home +
got supper for Pa.

Tuesday 16

Wednesday 17

Neglected to write + got the days changed.

This morning Mr. Lindell is fixing our
sister Lottie + I went down to Clarkston.
She got her dolomon cut. I got a dress +
some pins for the coral chain for Jennie.
Very pleasant and the snow most gone.

Tuesday 16

It snows very hard the ground looks as if
it was winter Will + Pa is clearing out the
sister. I have been to the other house
to visit with the Seldens + Mary B

Thursday 18

To day I have helped Mrs. Kali Bird move
went this morning staid all day. John
moved yesterday Mr. Flamboy the day
before Mr. Lick B to day.

Friday, March 19, 1880

Ma is not well. Grandma Nobley went from here yesterday. Lottie & Grandma is here today. Lottie is making her dolimons. I commenced my dress & finished my ironing after I finished my work this morning.

Saturday 20

In the forenoon I helped to do the Saturday's work. In the afternoon I worked on my dress. The Birds went after Mrs. Bilds monument. Pa helped unload it. Will got a suit of clothes.

Sunday 21

Warm and pleasant today we went to Mrs. Munger funeral to Mt Bethel Church & in the evening went to Oak Hill Bro Gagne talked on the subject of Sunday School.

Monday 22

Did not do much this afternoon. Ada Smith came here in the afternoon we went to Uncle Wirms, saw where Pa and Will was ditching had a good visit Wilber & Will brought home a large mud turtle.

Tuesday, March 23, 1880

The wind blows some & is colder Uncle John & Aunt Martha come here Lizzie & Aunt had a bad cold. Lottie & Ali is gon to help Judson move Grandma stais here tonight.

Wednesday 24

Lottie & Ali did not come home last night so Ade is here today. She helped me sew on my dress we went to bed early Had a nap today noon went to bed early to night.

Thursday 25

Ma & Ade & I went to Uncle Horaces today Had some fun going over there. Not as cold as it was yesterday. We are going to prayer meeting to night.

Friday 26

This morning I wrote a letter to Uncle Curtis' munger. The boys went to Clarkston. Ma & I went to Grandmas to eat dinner we came home I almost finished my dress. Day pleasant.

Saturday 27

It has rained some most of the time today. Pa has been to Mr. Ali & John & Liches

today, Will has shelled corn in the house
I wore my new dress in the evening.

Sunday, March 28, 1880

Went to Oak Hill this morning organized Sunday School. Pa is superintendent. I have the same class that I had last year in the evening went there again to services.

Monday 29

The wind blows cold. The sun shines warm. Ma & I have washed we did not hang out the white cloes until Tuesday. I've commenced to think about my Sunday school.

Tuesday 30

Ma & Grandma has gon to Uncle Williams
I ironed the celast cloes Lottie & I
went to Mr. Lecher Birds for the first
time I am worried some about nothing
much.

Wednesday 31

Ma has gon to Ellens. I am here alone.
Have got my S-S- lesson tie in Matthew 8
18-34 V. John Virgin came here to stay
to night. Miles Sutton come in the evening.
Day pleasant.

Thursday, April 1, 1883

This afternoon Lottie & I went to Aunt Juise's.
Sallie & Jennie was there. in the evening
we went to prayer meeting. Nute & Elva was
there - I went home with them.

Friday 2

It is raining so that Uncle John cannot go
to Oxford to have their pictures taken
my head akes very hard. Haven't done
any thing much today Lizzie is good.

Saturday 3

Last night it thundard very hard today
it is raining (or this forenoon) this
afternoon Elva & I went to Mr. Fischers
a visiting. We got a lemon & a little wishbone.

Sunday 4

It rains some this morning. Elva & I
staid in the bedroom most of the
forenoon. Nute & Elva & I went to
Ortonville. We heard Dr. Arnold preach,
large congradion.

Monday, April 5, 1880

It is pleasant to day. The men are gone to town meeting Elva has washed. I have helped some making shirts & we written in Helene Irishes Album.

Tuesday, 6

Elva has ironed this forenoon this afternoon we put on the boys clothes and had a time of our ^{in the evening} in the evening we got to caring on with the boys & had a good time.

Wednesday 7

This morning Lottie & Grandma came up after me. Grandma is a going to stay Elva & I had lots of fun (we had a chicken pie for dinner.) Cold to day.

Thursday 8

To day I am not feeling well. Ma is sick & was yesterday. They are all glad that I am at home. This evening we went to prayer meeting.

Friday, April 9, 1880

The wind is blowing hard. Horace helped me wash to day. I expected Mr. Sutton & the Bird girls here to sing this evening but they did not come.

Saturday 10

Ma is better so that she & Horace went to Clarkston, N.Y. McNight was here to sell a organ for the church it commenced to snow at noon & snowed until night.

Sunday 11

This morning went to Sunday School. There was 4 in my class a large attendance there. In the afternoon went to Mt Bethel. Ma is superintendent not very many there. Day cold. The sun shone.

Tuesday, May 18, 1880

Washed this forenoon. Dora came & gave me my first lesson for the term I give her \$1.00 for 24 lessons hour lessons. Very uncomfortable warm today Wilber is plowing for corn.

Wednesday, May 19, 1880

Last night Jim Herriman was here I had a invitation to go to a sepiage party. This afternoon Joe Bryon came here and staid until Friday. Had a good visit with him. I am not feeling very well. Rained today.

Thursday 20

Feeling better the rain is not over with raines some but not as hard as it did yesterday it come in sheets blown down some trees & fences. Pa & the boys were down on the plantation came home wet.

Friday 21

Joe went home this morning. Lottie has been having distress spells like Grandma has them. This afternoon it is raining steady & gentle I have practise two hours on my lesson today.

Saturday 22

It rained this morning I've practised my lesson two hours Mrs. Lisk Bird was here this afternoon this evening we met to Lemila's to sing Miles come home with me a staid a while this evening.

Sunday, May 23, 1880

Very pleasant. This morning Ma is not feeling well enough to go to Sunday School. Went to S.S. this afternoon. The girls done the singing. The were not there some from Clarkston were there.

Monday 24

Lottie is having the teeth ake but she is washing mat I have washed. Mr. Morehouse took supper here to night got along with my music lesson very well. Warm today think it will rain.

Tuesday 25

Very very warm to day the warmest day that we have had. My head is aking very hard Dora come after supper to give my lesson Lottie is sick with her teeth. Ma is there.

Wednesday 26

This morning I undertook to drive the cows to the plantation went to Saties to rest awhile in the afternoon went to see Lillie had a good time got wet coming home stoped to Elies sick visited with Miss Walters.

Thursday, May 27, 1880

My head aches hard & I am lame as can be
got me a corset of Frank this morning
Pa is planting corn. Elder Gagne took
dinner here. Pa & Ma went to prayer
meeting. I did not go Lottie is some
better.

Friday 28

Ma is almost sick. I am lame yet my
head is better we went to Clarkston
stoped to Elies got my dress. Got a
new dress & gloves. Went to the Dr and
got some Medison very warm
Pa finished planting.

Saturday 29

Not as warm as it was yesterday looks
like rain commenced raining soon enough
to keep us from the sing to Mr Birds
this evening feel disappointed but
perhaps all for the best.

Sunday 30

This morning some cloudy went to Sunday School.
A good many there It rained so we had to stay
awhile after school did not go now more
to day Ira & all took supper here

Monday, May 31, 1880

Ma is not feeling well so we did not wash.
I commenced my dress making a pleated quar
boldy, overskirt & three ruffles, 2 on
the skirt. Mrs. Smith & Lottie went to
Clarkston they got wet it rained hard
in the afternoon.

Tuesday, June 1, 1880

This forenoon I went to Aunt Julias to
get a overskirt pattern. Mrs. Smith &
Lottie & Grandma came here / got my dress
all cut out staid all night with Lottie
Agent staid here Pa & Horace went to
Lindon.

Wednesday 2

This forenoon I went to Ms Birds to get
some pie plant. Worked on my dress
got it over half done. no particular
events have taken place Nora came &
gave me a lesson.

Thursday 3

Sewed on my dress all the time I could spare.
Pa is to the plantation fixen fence. The
wheat is all headed out, lots of fruit, plenty
of rain, but the g. are very behind the
rest

Friday, June 4, 1880

Finished my new frock. Ma + Grandma has gone to John Birds a visiting Wilber is up to the plantation fixing fence over the ditch. Haven't but one chicken & I am mother to that, Day pleasant.

Saturday 5

It rained some but the boys went a fishing & Pa + Ma went to Clarkston Ma got me some lace & a ribbon for a tie. I am a lone + am feeling bad + lonesome finished my dress yesterday it would seem good to have it warm.

Sunday 6

This morning we had to wait for one shower to pass by before we could go to Sunday school a large attendance in the afternoon went to Mt Bethel not many there Satie & I started the to sing.

Monday 7

I am feeling very bad this morning but thought of going with Ada when she goes home. Went to see her Horace & I + stopped to Uncle Horacis to dinner had a good visit with Ada she was alone going home + id., (some cold.)

Tuesday, June 8, 1880

Today I feel as if I could not move
have been to bed some of the time. Ma &
Lottie have gone to Aunt Martha's. Dora
came & gave me my lesson Lena Harris
came with her I did not feel very good
about it.

Wednesday 9

Am feeling better than I did yesterday
Ma & I have done the washing. All is
working here today Mr. Chipp's have a
wooden weden this evening a serprise
have been married five years. Some
went from there.

Thursday 10

This morning looked some like rain but
all cleared away (have fixed the ^{Lamberrine} sunbeam)
P.S. - This afternoon it rained very hard for a
little while the lightning effected Lottie
& her folks, it struck somewhere.

Friday 11 P.S take notice

It is very sultry warm the rain did not cool
the air finished my ironing have been up
to the other house today the first time to
stay since I staid allnight been up

Saturday, June 12, 1880

It's very sultry warm Codwin's little son
was a week old last Wednesday a [grand]
son Luke came here this morning
Janie came after him after dinner with
a carriage.

Sunday 13

This morning it rained before S-S. not
very many there we went to Mt Bethel
not very many there. In the evening Miles
came here & staid awhile I caught cold by
standing in the door.

Monday 14

This morning I feel like old cheese got a
cold a don't feel very well any hay
Mrs. H. has washed & washed a quilt, it
rained in the afternoon so we Lottie & I
went a strawberryin.

Tuesday 15

My nose is getting a twisting & my throat
is sore. But thoes that dance must
pay the fiddler. Lottie has been down
here. This morning I wrote a letter to
Uncle Curtis sent it to the lake by
Wilber.

Wednesday, June 16, 1880

I hung out the clothes this morning ironed this afternoon Dora came after supper. Has been quite cool this week. Pa is working on the plantation. Lottie & Al has gone to Clarkston. Lottie got me a sunbonnet.

Wednesday, August 4, 1880

I got mostly ready to go to see Vilo Holmes this morning but Emilia did not come & I was disappointed. Did not do very much work. Lottie & Al was here to dinner. I wore some hoops.

Thursday 5

I commenced washing got it most done & Emilia came & we went up to see Vilo. We had a good visit going & coming & there her folks were gone & we had a good time. I saw Clara Elwood Day pleasant.

Friday 6

I have ironed this forenoon Dick Bird & Chancy come here. Dick & his folks & Ma went to Clarkston she took down some plums but she could not sell them. did not get home until dark.

Wednesday, August 11, 1880

I practised a while this morning Ma commenced the washing & then she went with Pa to Mr. Hille after 21 sheep, for two years. A pound of wool a head is what he gives.

Thursday 12

This morning Pa went to help Charlie thresh & Ma & I took Joe & went to Aunt Marthas. We had a good visit & we were weighed. I weighed 106 pounds Lizzie 25½ Grandma 200.

Friday 13

Ma went to help Lottie wash & I done the work & ironing. Haven't had any time to practise today. After supper Ma went down to see Aunt Harriet she is quilting & is better.

Saturday 14

It rained last night & this morning it stopped before ten. I haven't done much while it was raining. Mrs. Smith & [illegible] came here this afternoon. Emilia & I went to Grandmas & said Ada Smith was there.

Sunday, August 15, 1880

This morning we went to church. Libbie Walter went to Grandmas with us. After dinner we went to the Seminary & in the evening to the Baptist Church to a concert. Have had a spended time.

Monday 16

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We girls went down town to see Mr. Van Horn. He went to the mill pond & we had a boat ride & from there to the big lake & had another ride. Ada went home this afternoon & Emilia & I came home.

Tuesday 17

Ma is not feeling very well but she went to Uncle Silvans with Aunt Julia to help quilt. I lost my thin rail yesterday. It rained this afternoon. Pa came home from Linden.

Wednesday 18

Lottie has staid here to night. Allie got this morning. She brought her wash down here & we done it with ours. She helped me with our peaches. Dora came & gave me my lesson. Day pleasant.

Thursday, August 19, 1880

This morning Ma went to Clarkston set went to the temperance meeting but it rained so hard there was none until afternoon. Mr. Birds folks had a gathering at the Buttons & I was there.

Friday 20

I had to do my ironing this morning & tend to peaches not very much going on Pa is working on the party Mr. Bryon & all is helping him. All is out of sorts with him.

Saturday 21

Ma & I got most of our work done this forenoon & then I went with Pa to see Sattie. She came home with me & staid all night. Mile came & we set up & sang & talked until Sunday had lots of fun.

Sunday 22

Sattie had to go home in the morning. We had a large Sunday School. Not very many to Mt. Bethel. Elder B preached good After S.S. we young folks went to the cemetery. Mr. Austin's monument is there.

Monday, August 23, 1880

I feel good & tired but I done the washing.
After dinner Ma went down to see Aunt
Harriet she is sick Ma gave Jennie the
quilt that she pieced for her Grandma
came home from Aunt Martha's Saturday.

Tuesday 24

Sent word to Dora to come this morning
for I expected company but it rained &
Dora did not come nor the visitors.
Pa has Mr. Bryon & all working for
him. The mormans preached to the
schoolhouse Sunday & tonight.

Wednesday 25

It has been a long lonesome day. I looked
for Elva to come but it rained so she
did not come. I commenced to piece a
quilt called the family circle. Lottie &
Grandma has been here this afternoon
staid until night.

Thursday 26

It rains this morning but stopped long enough
for Horace to go to school Miss Phipps is
teaching. Rained so the men has been in
the house most of the day. I have
not got a stitch on.

Friday, August 27, 1880

Pa went to Davisburg this morning & I went with him as far as Mr Landon's to see Clara she was alone & I had a good visit with her she has made a start in religion. Horace came after me at night.

Saturday 28

I visited so hard yesterday that it made me most sick I havent done only what I had to do Ma took the dinner to the men & went to see Aunt Harriet she is better than she was. it commenced to rain after 3 & rained untill 6.

Sunday 29

It is raining when we got up it stopped a little while & I thought maby we could go to SS & we comenced to get ready but it comenced to rain & rained most of the day & we staid home all day it seemed rather lonesome.

Monday 30

Rainy this forenoon & foggy but this afternoon it is clearing off so I went up to Mr. John Birds & carried up my album their singing book & up to Aunt Juliese had a

Tuesday, August 31, 1880

This forenoon we were busy getting ready for company & picnic. This afternoon Lottie & Carrie & Allie Bird & Emilia came to see me we had a good visit. I paraded peaches in the evening. Day warm.

Wednesday, September 1

This forenoon Ma & I washed & peeled peaches & done some baking for tomorrow. This afternoon I ironed & baked & went to see Jannie a little while. Mrs. Lindell spoke on temperance to the school house to night.

Thursday 2

We went to Clarkston after Miss Clearlan got back at half past ten went up to the Church she read a duck piece & closed for dinner, we ate our dinner & she spoke again I did not get interested in it. Rained some.

Friday 3

Rainy and wet this morning but cleared away & the sun shone bright & pleasant. Aunt Julia's folks & Aunt Loving went to Lucy this forenoon & they all came here in the afternoon Lucy came with them Emilia came with

Saturday, September 4, 1880

Aunt Loving went away from here this morning.
Ma has had a hard head ache for two days.
About supper time Merit & May & Ed
Robertson & wife came here. In the evening
Miss Vliet came to stay all night she went
home.

Sunday 5

This morning the folks had a time eating
peaches they went to Grandmas so I went
to SS with Miles came home & went to
Grandma & Merit thought he would have
some fun. They went home so we went
to Mt. Bethel Silvester Buzzard was
baptised.

Monday 6

I feel rather lazy this morning. We did not
wash. Ora came here Jennie started for
her new home this morning I went down
to see Aunt Harriet after supper. Grandma
is not well today Aunt Vina is here.

Tuesday 7

We went up to Grandmas this morning & did not
come home to stay any. The wind blows &
looks like fall it is very cold, I think we

Wednesday, September 8, 1880

Ma staid with Grandma last night she is better
the Dr. is not coming again. I went down to
Clarkston after Aunt Vira this forenoon
Aunt Julia takes her to the Burg this
afternoon. Uncle Horace was here this
evening awhile.

Thursday 9

Ma is not very well Grandma is not as well
as she was yesterday I have washed this
forenoon & been up to the other house
twice. Mrs. Bird & Lottie came there
Lottie come down here & sang a while.
We heard of Mr. Baldwin's Death.

Friday 10

Grandma is better Lottie is not very well
Ma is feeling sick & so am I with the rest
of them. I haven't worked much today.
Cut my finger this morning bad. Ma
has been to Grandmas most of the day.

Saturday 11

The folks are better Wilber is feeling bad so
he did not work much yesterday or today.
I went to Aunt Julius to see if Emilia was
going to the State fair Lottie & Alice Bird was

Sunday, September 12, 1880

Wilber & I went to Clarkton to Mr. Baldwin's funeral.
There was a large congregation. Elder Vandorn preached
his text was in Rev 19 - part of the 6 verse.
No Sunday School to the school house nor
Mt. Bethel (it rained some)

Monday 13

Ma is almost sick but she churred & helped
do the work & I done the washing.
Emilia come here in the afternoon & staid
a while & Lottie & Grandma came. it seemed
quite natural to see them.

Tuesday 14

Last night I was sick in the night am not
feeling well today, but I ironed & got ready
& went to Uncle Horaces to stay all night
Miss Phippe came here from school & staid
tonight Emilia & I had a good time.

Wednesday 15

This morning we started for Detroit early.
had a pleasant day & a good time. Went
to the fair ground & staid there untill
three & went to the city hall & houses of
correction and other places. Came to
Uncle Horaces at half past one. Tired &

Thursday, September 16, 1880

Pa came home with Emilia & I from Uncle Horace's this morning. Emilia & I are lame & am willing to go again to the fair today. I had a nap after dinner & it rested me a good deal. Day pleasant.

Friday 17

I don't feel much like work today. Mr. Smith is staying with Al for a day or two. Grandma was sick last night. Ben Westoby called here this evning. Ira & Al came here to sing. Uncle Silas came to get a note signed & a buggy.

Saturday 18

Ma and Grandma & Horace & I went to Clarkston this forenoon. I staid home & done the work. Am not as lame as I was yesterday. Mr. Smith gave Lottie a cubbold all brought it home this evening. Warm today.

Sunday 19

Rains this morning so there is no Sunday School either way. Elder Gagne came here & was going to Mt. Bethel but no one went until evening to the school house. There he preached good & clear doctrine.

Monday, September 20, 1880

After I got most of the work done I went & helped Lottie wash. in the afternoon Uncle Horace came Pa took him part of the way home I went over to Mrs. Birds. Miss Vliet was there I staid to supper with them.

Tuesday 21

Ma & I washed had a large wash Lottie has been down here a while this forenoon this afternoon Ma went with Pa to Delores a visiting. Dora came here I had a good visit with her while she staid Pa & Ma went to Clarkston at night.

Wednesday 22

I got ready and went to Delores when Pa went to work Lottie & I were going to Ellene but we changed our minds & went to see Ella Dompson she is lonely & not well. We came back & I come home with Pa.

Thursday 23

Last night Mr. & Mrs. Bird came here & spent the evening we had a large watermelon to eat. I churned most of the forenoon & this afternoon I have ironed. Harry & Rastus & Ben have worked here to day.

Friday, September 24, 1880

Last night Edwin & Bertha & the baby came here & staid all night they went away about ten this morning. I went and carried down Pa & Wilbers dinner. Miss Vliet came & staid with me to night

Saturday 25

Tuesday, September 28, 1880

This morning I went to the other house and got Lotties & Grandmas clothes and washed them with ours in the afternoon it rained & the line broke & let part of the clothes on the ground All came & staid most of the afternoon.

Wednesday 29

Grandma came here this forenoon & again in the afternoon Lottie & Jennie came too I did part of the ironing to day we had chicken for dinner & we had lots of fun about Pa is helping thresh to Johns.

Thursday 30

Horace has gon to help Mr. Bird drive hogs to Clarkston I have finished my ironing I am not feeling well I have a cold Pa & Ma went to Clarkstan this afternoon A pedler came along & Ma got three goblets.

Friday, October 1, 1880

We have got ready for the thrashers & made some of the garments that Ma brought home cloth for Aunt Lucy & Nettie came here a while this afternoon Mr. Radic has been there the thrashers came

Saturday, October 2, 1880

The thrashers had to stop and go to Davisburg this forenoon came back to dinner Elder Benton was here to dinner it rained so the thrashers had to stay all night 5 of them & Charlie Bird to

Sunday 3

We went to Sunday School in the morning none in the afternoon Elder Gagne preached good quite a large congregation he came home with us it rained so he did not go to Oak Hill in the evening.

Monday 4

The thrashers came this forenoon & threshed until noon & had to stop & go or send to Detroit again. In the afternoon Eddie came after me & went home with him. in the evening they went to Orlinville

Tuesday 5

This morning Uncle John & Jim started for St Johns to the fair. Uncle Johns sister Mrs. Baldwin came here for a visit. I have a hard cold have laid on the lounge most of the afternoon,

Wednesday, October 6, 1880

My cold is better and I am more like myself. I have sewed some & done the some of it & had a good visit & a good time. Would like to hear from home. Nute went to Orlinville this evening.

Thursday 7

Aunt Martha has sewed and I have tended to most of the work & have been to bed this afternoon. Lizzie is good natured. Uncle John has not got home, there was a big frost last night.

Friday 8

I am feeling better than I did yesterday. Aunt Martha has been sewing most of the day. This evening Uncle John and Jim come home brought some blankets & a chair for Lizzie. cold today.

Saturday 9

Aunt Martha hasn't sewed any today. She took Lizzie & went a calling a little while & I wrote in my receipt book that Uncle John gave me. The boys are gone to Orlinville. Nute gave me his picture that he got to night.

Sunday, October 10, 1880

Have staid here all day only Aunt Martha & I went & took a walk. Sophia Hier came here to supper. Aunt Jude was here in the evening very pleasant today.

Monday 11

The washer women came & washed & ironed to day the men did not come that intended to come & put up the wind mill. Willie & Aurther Blodget came & did not know them had a good visit with them.

Tuesday 12

Uncle John & Eddie went to Pontiac this morning they were picking apples. The boys went to Orinville in the evening they came home & we all had a good lively time.

Wednesday 13

The boys came home this forenoon they started about eleven from Uncle Johns. He went to Orinville in the morning & then after dinner Eddie brought me home Ma did not know the boys were here untill night. They came down to supper Ma knew them

Thursday, October 14, 1880

Today they have staid in the house most
of the time Willie went to the cider mill.
With All & Arthur staid in the house.
In the evening we went to prayer meeting.

Friday 15

Willie & Arthur goes away Wilber & Horace
takes them to Holly they have a good
time going I am sorry to see them go
away they are lively & good company.
it will be lonesome for me now.

would wash finished the washing about noon.
Lottie & Grandma were down here this forenoon
expected Miss Phipps she did not come
nor did Dora.

Wednesday 20

This morning I went and done Lotties washing
for her Grandma had the palpitation of the

Ma is up to Grandmas. Katie Losch came

I did not wash. Ma is up to Grandmas & it is
raining some today. I have almost made Wilbore's

Ma came home and I went up there to finish the wash & Elder Benton & his wife came to dinner after dinner Dora came but went away without giving me a lesson Dora has been married 5 years & the nabora gave her a surprise.

Dear Grandson:

I was surprised to get so many letters at once the first time. I thought I would answer your letter first. I was glad to hear from you. I was sorry you had the rumatis, but glad you could be around. I was glad to hear from the friends and get the news. I am well and let you know I am doing some work. I helped Horace cut and saw the wood last winter. I had one man saw and I could run it alone.

I done some clearing and put up over 10 cords of wood and I sowed 1/4 of a acre of land to onions and they did not come up good and Horace and Lee put it beets and chickery with more land with it and I have been cleaning up a piece of new ground for potatoes. It will take me two days more. Horace will fit it for me and it will give me some work. I have been to church since I came home last fall all but three Sundays 1 cold 1 ice 1 wet.

Lee passed ninth grade. Hallie has 3-25 chickens. Horace has some beets ready to work in. Horace is milking 9 cows and will have more next week.


They have put up 2 new houses this spring in Munger and expect they will build two more.

A Letter about Nettie's Death

Jan. 8, 1874 Nettie and John went over to our folks in a lumber wagon, the same night at 1/2 past 10, I went to Detroit with a load of potatoes and Nettie was taken sick at 12 o'clock. I came home tuesday night about 10 and found her very bad but did not get the Dr. until Monday the 15th after dinner, he came tuesday and made an operation the 16th, the 10th she had a chill and I telephoned for the Dr. and her folks They came the 19th and the Dr. came on the 20th and the 21st Sunday I had a council of Dr. Leabaron of Pontiac and at night Dr. Fink operated on her at about 9 o'clock and after the operation she sank down and she kept going down and at about daylight the Dr. told her she could not live and she talked to all of the folks and gave the children advice She lingered till the afternoon of the 22nd at 1 o'clock and passed away on wednesday the 24th, we held the funeral at Fenell school house at 11a.m. the minister that officiated was the Methodist at Walled Lake Rev. [redacted] text Luke 8-52 verse, Weep not she is not dead, but sleepeth, the choir from Walled Lake sang, We shall sleep but not for ever.

JOHN E. YOUNG, 70, DIES IN WATERFORD



A session of the Court held at the City of Waterford on the 16th day of February, 1928, before Hon. Dan A. McCaffery, Justice of Probate, and before the State of Michigan filed a petition against John E. Young deceased. It was shown that said Young had been admitted to Probate as an incompetent on the 1st day of January, 1922, and that the qualifications of said patient are such that Claude C. Young, his son, is his legal representative and will or can act in his stead in all matters pertaining to him. It is ordered that on the 16th day of March, 1928, he be admitted to a State Hospital for the Insane, to be maintained for the sum of \$100 per month. It is further ordered that when it is determined by the Board of Control that he may be fit to live by himself, he be given a copy of his rights and responsibilities and the like, and on the day of discharge he shall be given a copy of his rights and responsibilities.

At the time of his admission to the State Hospital, John E. Young was a widow, residing at Waterford, Michigan. He was born in New York on April 1, 1858, and died in Waterford on February 16, 1928, aged 70 years, 5 months, 13 days. He was buried in the Waterford Cemetery.

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John E. Young, 70, died Saturday morning at his home in Waterford, Mich., at 119 W. Main Street, of acute heart disease. Death followed an illness of several years.

Mr. Young was born in West Bloomfield Township in 1858, was married to Minnie N. Murphy. They have three children surviving, Mrs. Manda Grimmer, Farmington, Claude S. of Orchard Lake and Howard G. of Wailes Lake.

Surviving also is the widow, two brothers, George and Darwin of Wheeler, Mich.; two sisters, Miss Sarah Green and Mrs. Nellie Beutner of Northville; and eight grandchildren.

Funeral service will be held at Farmer's Funeral Parlor Saturday at 2:30 p.m. with Rev. Huey of Waterford officiating. Burial will be in Richardson cemetery.

The Masonic Lodge of Commerce, to which Mr. Young belonged, will have charge of the service at the grave.

MUNGER

Munger was settled in 1874 and named for Curtis and Algermon S. ^{Wettie's great} Munger who owned land around it's ^{uncles} Detroit and Bay City Railroad station called Munger's. Horace D. ^{Wettie's Uncle} Blodgett was the first post master June 6, 1876.

Munger became a prosperous little farm community after much work was done in draining the swamp lands. Once drained, the land proved very rich and able to produce bumper crops. The opening of chicory and sugar beet factories in Bay City, made farming an industry in Munger.

Considerable revenues were also derived from the What Cheer Coal mine. The wealth from the mine was spent on drainage and betterment of the community.

The Munger area has become the Potato Capital of Michigan. The outstanding community spirit of the people today is an example to all of us. The Munger Volunteer Fire Department

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shows what can be done when people work together in co-operation. Recreational facilities for the community are constantly improved. The Munger Firemen sponsor the Munger Potato Festival known far and wide; the revenue is used for community projects.
