The soil of the farmer's acre is large matter of farmers is the depth of plowing. It is not the amount of water that is the straw, but the depth to which it is plowed.

Nature has placed the richest portion of the soil very near the surface, and she has constructed plants with their feeding roots very near the surface also.

Such rapid improvements have been made in farm implements that it is getting to be a serious question with the farmer what he shall buy, and what he can afford to do without.
