A Message From the Chicago.

This goes far to prove the statement of a man named Plummer, of South Haven, who stated that he saw the Chicago near that port on the afternoon of Jan. 21, and it will be proved that the Chicago was only lost by the breaking of her machinery or losing the steering gear. Her hull in that case is undoubtedly near shore, and search will begin for it at once.

Arrested for Murder After Three Years.
George W. King, a Muskegon druggist, was arrested on a warrant charging him with the murder of Nathan Douglas, three years ago. Douglas's daughter is the complainant. He lived on his farm near Fruitport for many years with his daughter, and had deeded all his property to her. Four years ago an aunt of King's went to live with them, and about a year later she married Mr. Douglas. The property was then deeded to his wife. The officers claim that shortly afterwards King went to Fruitport and remained a week, and that within 14 days the old man, sickened and died. Mrs. H. H. King, King's wife, was also arrested as an accomplice in the crime.

Charlevoix has two Chandler townships, that being the name of one of the townships recently annexed with the Beaver islands.

Mayor Walker, of Ann Arbor, says the city is paying twice as much for electric lights as it should pay. He advocates municipal ownership.

Louis Harnick, employed in a Menominee brewery, was horribly burned while varnishing a beer vat and cannot recover. His lamp overturned.

C. G. Austin, of Owosso, visited a traveling clothing firm and while he was trying on a pair of trousers some thief ripped open his old ones and stole \$50.

The Monroe block, in which were located the halls of I. O. O. F. and A. O. U. W., the Hesperia Herald office, Hesperia primary school and two residences, burned.

On May 11, 11 of the suburban mail carriers at Grand Rapids will travel on bicycles. The carriers will buy the wheels themselves and the government will allow a rental on them.

The Eberbach Drug & Chemical Co., of Ann Arbor, has been given the contract to furnish the "University with supplies for the coming year. They took it away from eastern houses who had it last year.

Clyde and Leonard Corright, aged 11 and 12, were run over by a log roller at Springport, and were so badly crushed that it was feared they both would die. The softness of the ground alone saved them.

Editor Edward Forsyth has been appointed deputy collector of customs at Cheboygan.

Israel Austin, near Rea, was arrested charged with beating his wife, who lies in a critical condition.

The Kirby Carpenter Co.'s machine and electric power works at Menominee were damaged by fire to the extent of \$3,000.

Receiver Snow, of the Adrian Electric Belt railway, resumed running street cars after the line had been idle nearly a year.

Bell Banz, alias King, an alleged sandbagger of Muskegon, escaped from the Muskegon sheriff and five White Cloud officers.

The Hillsdale college authorities feel encouraged. The number of literary students is in excess of that of the past seven years.

Menominee lumbermen deny the reports that the lumber supply will soon be gone. They declare that there is enough to last 15 or 20 years.

Mrs. Spencer, state librarian, has already had 15 applications for the traveling library and three for the associate, under the new law.

The Antrim Iron company's furnaces at Marcellon are once more all ablaze after having been shut down a year. This will give employment to 125 men.

Mrs. Dr. A. Jeffries and Mrs. W. McSherry, of Hubbardston, are said to be heirs to a \$2,500,000 estate in Buffalo, N. Y., together with four others.

Jennie Crothers, a 15-year-old girl of Alden, became very angry at her father, as she thought he was scolding her, and attempted suicide, taking laudanum.

Archie Davis, a young man, was found drowned in a well near Hatton. The story is that he fell in while watering horses, but foul play is suspected.

Wm. Whitman was arrested at Adrian, charged with incest with his simple-minded sister. His brother was recently arrested on a similar charge.

Dr. H. C. Guillott, for several years past on the medical staff of the insane asylum at Pontiac, has resigned his position, and will spend some time in England.

Mackinac Island will be the greatest passenger port on the lakes this summer. Thirty-six passenger steamers will stop every week, and some of them every day.
