



MEASUREMENT OF MEMORY. Some Very Interesting Experiments That

crude, as they still are, it is nevertheless a great advance to be able to introduce the concept of measurement into this problem at all, says Prof. Alfred Binet in the "Annee Biologique." So far attempts have been made to measure but one kind of memory, the direct faculty of acquisition. The experiments deal with the number memory-images that can be stored up at a single trial, without allowing the subject time to rest. This is called in English the "mental span" of the memory. I have proposed for it the term "faculte de prehension." Several successive investigations have already been made on the measurement of the memory for figures and syllables; these are localized memories, the development of which cannot be considered as a sign of the development of the other memories; we must, therefore, make many reservations in interpreting the conclusions to be drawn from these experiments. The experiment may be made as follows: A series of figures is read to the subject at a regular speed (the speed used is in general two figures per second) and without any special accentuation. As soon as he has heard the series the subject, hays. ing been told before hand of the requirement, endeavors to repeat the agures without error and in the order in which he heard them. The experiment is repeated several times, beginning with a small number of figures-e. g ... four, which any adult can give correctly; it is then increased to five figures, then to six, and so on, until a number is reached which the subject can no longer repeat correctly; care is taken to repeat each trial and allow fact that they have less control over a tramp fly, stealing a ride on the lar- their attention. 





Flies That Steal Rides. That certain flies will steal a ride on the back or wings of some larger insect, and that this labor saying process may be habitual, is indicated by the observations of the Rev. A. E. Eaton, who noticed in Algeria a small fly riding on the backs of big beetles. They settle_down on the prothorax and on the base of the wing covers, ometimes half a dozen females on one beetle. The beetles occasionally-throw themselves on their backs to try and get rid of them by rolling, but the flies elude all their efforts to dislodge them, dodging out of harm's way into the joinings of the thorax and out again, and darting from back to breast and back again, in a way that drives the beetle nearly mad. In vain she scrapes over them with her legs; in yain does she roll over or delve down among the roots of the herbage; the flies are as active as monkeys, and there is no shaking them off." . A somewhat similar case has been reported by Mrs. Slosson, who observed at Franconia a lace wing fly (Chrysopa), which seemed to have a black raised spot upon each wing, and others with but a single-spot.
