

Renovating a Run-Down Farm. I want to tell you, readers, what I would try to do with such a farm if I says W. J. in Hoard's Dairyman. would first repair the barn so as t make the stable warm, and make tight floor and gutter, and save all the liquid marare; then I would build a silo. In a word, I would try to work into a more intensive system of farming, and

my main crops would be ensilage corn and clover. There is but little profit in dairy farming in these times of intense competition, without a good equipment buildings and implements. The farmer without these, especially in winter dairying, cannot compete with the farmer who has warm and convenien barks and feeds silage and clover hay. Such a change in the method of farming as I would try to bring about, would require a few years to get it well established. I would begin by plowing all the ground that I could cover with manure for corn. I would not use commercial fertilizers for corn, except a little drilled in with the corn planter. I would not try to do without at least plant the largest variety of corn that would mature ears in my locality. I would plant it thinly in drills three feet apart, and give it frequent cultivation until the last of July, then jus before the last cultivation I would sow crimson clover between the row of corn and take my chances of its liv clover roots in the ground would probably pay the cost of seeding.
