BRILLIANT MILITARY PARADE.

Cheering Crowds Line the Route Taken by President McKinley and the Great Sailor Secretary Long Makes Presentation Speech.

Washington, Oct. 3.—Washington went wild over the hero of Manila today and gave him such an ovation as has rarely, if ever, been seen in the national capital.

The start from Mrs. McLean's residence was made promptly at 10 o'clock. Admiral Dewey, emerged from the house with Chairman Moses of the local reception committee...

Accompanied by an escort of police and committeemen and headed by the Marine band, the admiral was driven to the white house through the cheering crowds.

Capt. Lambertson, Lieut. Brumby and Lieut. Caldwell also left their carriages, and were warmly greeted by the members of the reception committee.

Only a few minutes elapsed before the admiral reappeared with the president and took seats in the white house carriage.

It was a magnificent and inspiring sight as the parade swung into the long stretch of the handsome thoroughfare.

At the head of the line rode Major-General Nelson A. Miles, commanding general of the army, in the full uniform of his rank.

And then Dewey. All that had gone before was but a brilliant prelude to the coming of the man of Manila.

At the capitol the ceremonies were singularly impressive. The presentation speech was made by Secretary Long, who paid a glowing tribute to the man who today fits the hearts and minds of his countrymen.

The gift of the Nation to Rear-Admiral George Dewey, U. S. N., in Memory of the Victory at Manila Bay, May 1, 1898.

The sword grip is covered with fine shark-skin, bound with gold wire and inlaid with gold stars.

The scabbard is of thin steel, damascened in gold, with sprays of delicate sea plant, the ross marinus, typical of fidelity, constancy and remembrance.

The ferrule, or lower end of the scabbard, terminates in entwined gold dolphins.

The sword box is of white-oak, inlaid with black velvet, and at the center of the cover has a gold shield surmounted by an eagle, and inscribed with a single star and the words: "Rear-Admiral George Dewey, U. S. N."

NOT SAILED WITHIN TIME.

First Race for America's Cup Not Decisive. SHAMROCK FINISHES AHEAD.

English Yacht in a Manner Outrivals Her American Opponent—Splendid Exhibition of Seamanship Displayed on Both Vessels.

New York, Oct. 3.—The first race for the America's cup was declared off the vessels not covering the distance within the time limit.

New York, Oct. 3.—The contest for the America cup began at 11:12 this morning. The Columbia and the Shamrock crossed the starting line east of Sandy Hook, at 11:15 o'clock, bound

down the Jersey coast before the north-northeast wind, to the turning point, a stake buoy, fifteen miles from the Hook and three miles off Long Branch.

At 11:12 the starting gun was fired. Sir Thomas' challenger went over the line at exactly 11:15:37, and Columbia at 11:16:20.

At 11:41 it was reported from Navesink Highlands that the Shamrock appeared to have increased her lead somewhat.

The Shamrock at 11:47 was pulling rapidly away from the Columbia, either through favorable shift of wind or because of her being better handled.

The Columbia and Shamrock at 11:49 crossed the course rapidly. Shamrock apparently increasing her lead. The wind moderated and the choppy sea became less boisterous.

At 12:07 the Shamrock led the Columbia by four minutes and forty-nine seconds.

The stake boat is anchored east of Etobron. The Columbia at 12:15 began gaining rapidly on the Shamrock, both boats pulled the Columbia increasing her lead until she easily passed the stake boat.
