BECKWITH IS DEAD.

The Disgrace Brought On Him by the Chadwick Woman. C. T. Beckwith, president of the defunct Citizens' National bank of Oberlin, O., died last night, after two days of unconsciousness, during which disolution was expected at any moment. Solution was expected it any monitor, only the family surrounded the death-bed of the banker. Mr. Beckwith was about 65 years of age. On December 14 last the federal grand jury in Cleveland returned five indictments against Beckwith upon the charge of violating the national banking laws in connection with the loans made to Mrs. Cassie L. Chadwick by the Citizens' National bank of Oberlin, of which de-cased was the president. From the day of his arrest, Beckwith's health failed rapidly as a result of worry over his troubles. He frequently de-ciand during his illness that he wanted to die. For several days prior to his death he refused to take food in any: form. Death testified directly from heart trouble.
