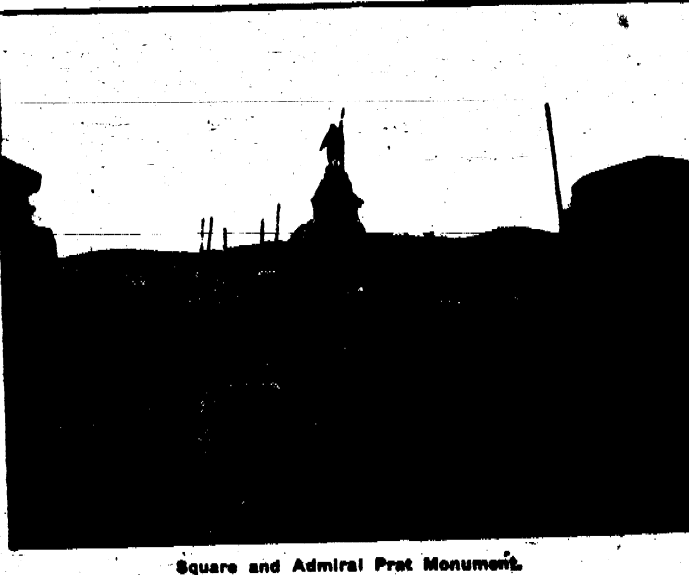

Legislation.—Among the laws which the next legislature will be asked to pass is one providing for the organization of insurance companies to insure threatening machinery. At present, threatening machinery owners have considerable trouble to get insurance for their property, and under existing laws it is doubtful if a company can be legally organized in Michigan to insure threatening machines, the expense of insuring being so high.

Opinion by Attorney General.—Several opinions of importance concerning the primary election law as affected by the recent decision of the United States supreme court in the case of the apportionment unconstitutional were filed by Attorney General Bird on Monday. The opinion in all districts were altered by the failure of the apportionment act of 1902 and the constitutionality of the act. State's Increase in Wealth.—The first reliable data to be used by the state board of equalization in fixing the equalized value of the several counties has been prepared by the auditor general's department. 
