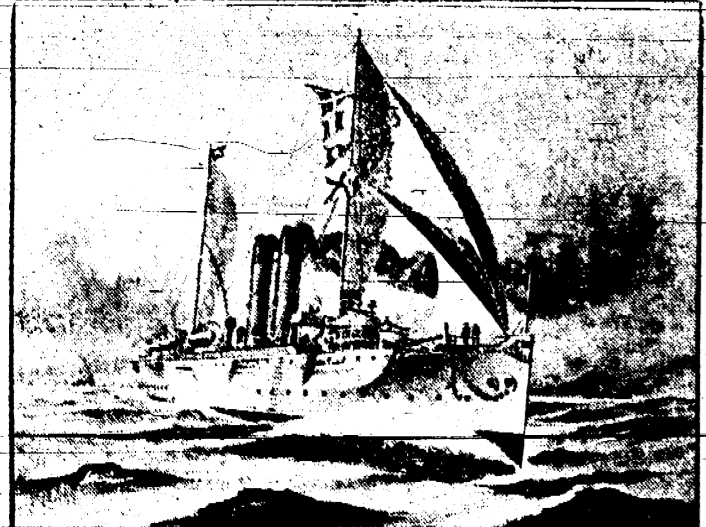


SENDS TAFT TO INVESTIGATE STATUS OF AFFAIRS IN CUBA
