The idea is that some measure should be taken to bring home to the average citizen the responsibility that rests upon him in casting his ballot not only for the officials to whom he elects, but also for the character of the state government. The measure would also provide for the numerous measures that are now directed to the electors for their judgment. Those who fail to vote without a reasonable excuse, Mr. Barbour would punish by fines and imprisonment, while as a reward of merit for those who do vote they should receive three dollars or some amount on their taxes. 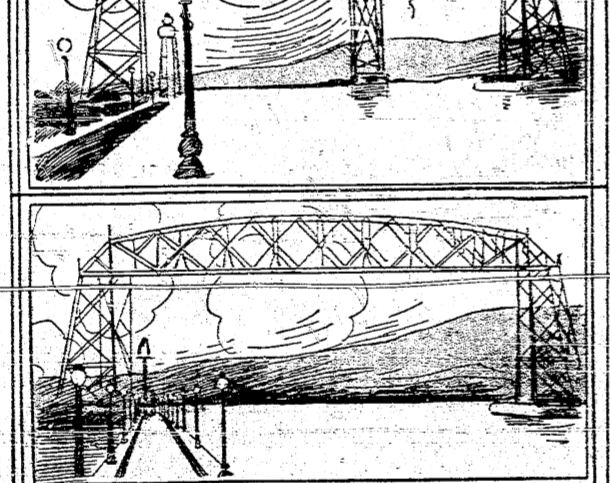
