New York, Jan. 21.—Mrs. Evelyn Nesbit Thaw told her story Monday for the second time. The repetition lacked the vitality of the first recital but the great crowd in the courtroom where her husband, Harry Kendall Thaw, is on trial for the killing of Stanford White, listened intently to every word.

Justice Dowling had ruled that he found no warrant in the law for closing the doors against the public, and there was a great clamor for admittance from a throng which hung about the building all day long. District Attorney Jerome, failing in his move to exclude spectators, took occasion, when it came his turn to cross-examine the witness, to bring out all of the details of the first trial which Mr. Littleton of the defease had omitted on his direct inquiry of the witness. Mr. Jerome also sought to block Mrs. Thaw's testimony in its entirety on the ground that a conversation which occurred three years before the tragedy could not have any bearing on Thaw's mental condition on the right of the homicide. Justice Dowling overruled the objection.
