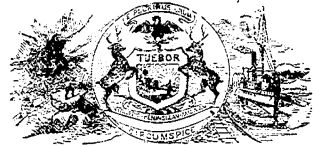


LIBERTY BONDS ARE SAFE

Hastings—Thirty thousand brook trout have been planted in the various streams in Barry county.

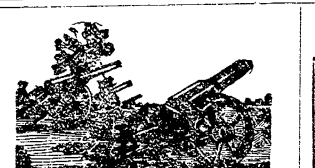

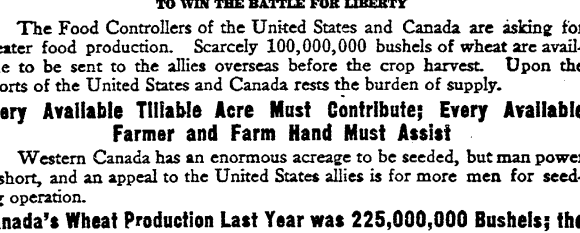

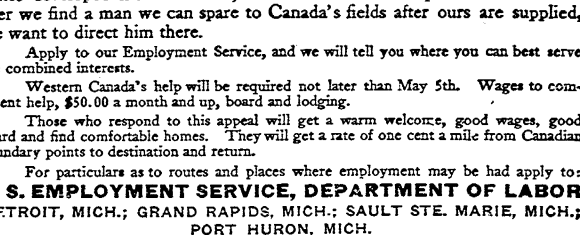
