# Financial Arrangements:

This hospital is a non-profit institution, has no large endowments, and receives no aid from Community Chest, city, county or state funds. Our ability to furnish care to you is, therefore, solely dependent upon payments made by you and other patients.

#### HOSPITAL INSURANCE

This hespital is a participating member of the Michigan Höspital Service Blue Crose Plan and also has a working arrangement with the American Hospital Medical Benefit if you have coverage under either of these plans, your identification care will be sufficient evidence for your admission, subject, of course, to our immediate verification; for payment is refused in full of in part by the insurance company, you are responsible for this indemnity and will be expected to take sare of the payment. In the same manner as any private pationt.

## OTHER INSURANCE PLANS

If you have insurance coverage under any other plan, you will be required to settle your account personally. Where, you see dispharged from the hespital-we will furnish you with the necessary, itemized statement, to assure you proper reimbursement-from-your insurance company.

# PRIVATE PATIENT ACCOUNTS

- As a private patient with no insurance coverage you will be expected to follow the following rules in payment of your account.
  - 1. You will be required to make an advance deposit on admission. The amount of the deposit will depend upon the known facts of your case regarding estimated period of hospitalization, laboratory work, special-
- medications, etc.

  2. If you should be hospitalized for more than one week, you will be furnished weekly statements by the Business Office and will be expected to settle your account on a current week to week basis.

### Visiting Hours:

The following schedule has been adopted in the best interests of the patients, to insure a maximum of rest and quiet:

- Private Rooms. 11:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m. Adult Wards 2:00-3:00 p.m. 7:00-8:00 p.m. Pavillion I. 2:00-3:00 p.m. on Tues., Thurs., Sat., and Sunday only. No evening hours.
- Clinic III. No visitors at any time

  Not more than two visitors should be at the
  bedside at any one time and they should confine
  their stay to short periods. The hospital authorities reserve the right to further limit or cencel
  visiting privileges when necessary for the welfare
  of the patient.

Patients in Maternity Section are permitted two only visitors, the father and either the maternal or paternal grandmother. These visitors must be registered with the Nursing Office.

No visitors are permitted in the Maternity Section while infants are with the mother.

No children under 14 years of age are permitted to visit in any section.

#### Valuables:

The hospital will not be responsible for money or valuables retained by any patient. Limited provisions are provided in the business office for safe-keeping of such items.

### General Information:

LIBRARY facilities are provided at your bedside each Wednesday.

STATIONERY will be provided free of charge upon request to your nurse.

GUEST TRAYS may be ordered from your nurse. A charge will be made for this service.

BARBER services are available if proper notice is given to your nurse.

RADIOS are available on a rental basis for your use. All radios are to be used with discretion. The hospital authorities at all times reserve the right to forbid the use of any or all radios when the welfare of any patient is threatened.
