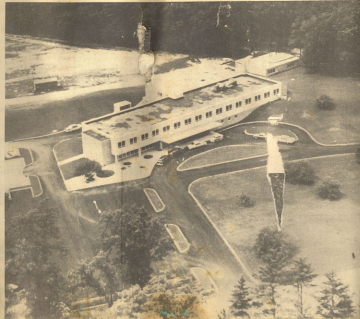

NEW OSTEOPATHIC HOSPITAL—Eight hours and sevenstone-laying ceremonies Monday will mark dedication of the new million-dollar Traverse City Osteopathic hospital at Mission Avenue and Airport Avenue road. The new facility, scheduled to be put into operation on August 21, will be open to public inspection on Sunday from noon until 5:30 p.m., with convenience-laying ceremonies scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Designed for 50 beds now and expansion to limited capacity, the new hospital will replace the present 20-bed on South Main at 425 Bay street. 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Open House Sunday at New Osteopathic Hospital

The new million-dollar Traverse City Osteopathic hospital at Munson avenue and Airport Access road on the city's east side will be open to public inspection at an open house from noon until 4:00 p.m. Sunday.

The open house event will mark dedication of the new 56-bed hospital, designed for expansion to

150-bed-capacity, and scheduled to be put into operation on August 21. Sanford L. Mead, hospital administrator, said today.

Also scheduled as a part of the dedication is a cornerstone-laying ceremony at 2:30 p.m., with Dr. Otterbein Dressler, pathologist at Garden City Osteopathic hospital, as guest speaker.

Assisting Dr. Dressler at the laying of the cornerstone will be Dr. M. O. Johnson and Dr. R. W. Doerman, founders of a Traverse City clinic; Dr. Wilson L. Brutt, local hospital board president; Dr. Kenneth C. Taylor, president of the medical staff organization; and Clarence Foss, honorary member of the hospital staff and prior president of the board for 12 years.

Members of the hospital staff will serve as guides, provide in-

formation, and serve refreshments to open house visitors, and a gift shop in the new facility will be open. An oil painting, "Michigan Forest Trails," presented to the hospital by Maud Miller Hoffmaster of Traverse City, will be on display at the gift shop staffed by volunteer hostesses.

A luncheon for the hospital medical staff and guests at the Park Place hotel will precede the cornerstone ceremonies.
