

Hospital Fund Dinner at 6:30 This Evening

Some 500 persons are expected to hear Dr. Morris Fishbein, principal speaker tonight, at the community dinner to be given by the James Decker Munson hospital in the gymnasium of Central High School. The dinner gets underway at 6:30.

Persons from all sections of the Grand Traverse Region, as well as many summer visitors, have accepted invitations to the dinner, purpose of which is to acquaint the public with the needs of the hospital.

Dr. Fishbein, who only recently returned from Europe, arrived by plane from his headquarters in Chicago early this afternoon and will leave immediately following his talk to resume a conference with his publishers.

He will be preceded by several prominent community leaders, including representatives of the hospital. One of the highlights of the dinner will be the acceptance by Spencer Mieras of the co-chairmanship in the public campaign for \$300,000 to complete an addition to the hospital. Mr. Mieras will make acceptance not only in his own behalf but also in behalf of H. W. Heidebreder and M. J. Macintosh, who will serve with him.

Under this trio the campaign organization already is taking form at the top level. Great strides were made earlier this week with the

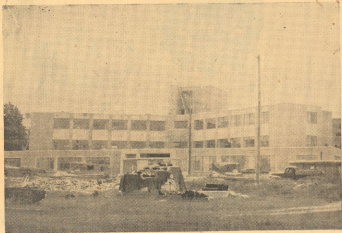
naming of Garrett Arnold to serve as chairman of the men's organization.
