The Annual Report of the Secretary for
the year ending May 1st 1907

To the Honorable Council of the City of Niles: Complying with the law governing the operations of Public libraries within the State of Michigan the directors of the Niles Public Library beg permission to submit to the council of the city of Niles the Annual report for the years 1906 and 1907: namely A report from the Secretary, treasurer and Librarian.

Secretary's Report.

As we sum up the work of the year just past - the third year of the existence of the library, we feel that it is no longer an experiment; but that the work and money have been the best kind of any investment for the city.

The library has done a wonderful work for the young of the town as the librarians report will show.

The demand for a better class of reading is greater than a year ago. The reading room is used to a greater extent, and through the splendid efforts

Of our librarian the work is growing
in every department.

For reasons of economy the board
has failed in making practical use
of the outside lamp post. It seems to
them that the lamps should be
lighted and that it should be done
by the City. We still hope that the
Board of Public Works will see that
this is done free of cost.

The influence of the library has
grown and is spreading, as is shown
by the affiliation of the Miles township
and the Howard townships librarians with
ours. The proper housing, shelving and
cataloguing has been shown to be a
great help in circulating books. And it is
to avail themselves of this service that
the two townships referred to have turn-
ed over their books amounting to over four-
teen hundred (400) volumes to the Miles
Library. For this service they promised all
money voted for library use to the board
of the Miles Public Library, which money will
be used in adding new books.

In reviewing the past year we are struck with the steady growth - the increased interest and the stability of this wonderful improvement which the city dedicated four years ago.

Each year has shown an improvement over the preceding one in the number of persons using the reading room, the number of books drawn and the quality of the reading matter called for. The per cent of fiction read being smaller than ever before.

500 BOOKS ADDED

Much Interest Has Been Shown by
Woman's Progressive League and
Citizens in General--Board Suf-
fered Great Loss By the
Death of Mr. Dana.

Ninth annual report of the Directors of the Niles Public library for the year ending April 16, 1913, is given below:

To the common council of the city of Niles,

Gentlemen: The Directors of the Niles Public Library, herewith submit their annual reports in pursuance of the statute in such case made and provided.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

At the first meeting of the board in the year just ended, the following officers were elected:

President, W. W. Newman.

President Vice, F. C. Dean.

Treasurer, Mrs. Louise Jerome.

Secretary, A. J. Hillman.

The president of the board appointed the following committees:

Building and grounds: Mrs. W. W. Dresden, Miss Alice Quimby, Rev. F. Rahn.

Books: Fred C. Dean, Mrs. W. I. Tyler, Rev. F. Rahn, E. C. Dana.

Finance: E. C. Dana, Miss Alice Quimby, Mrs. W. I. Tyler.

Librarian: Miss Orrill P. Coolidge.

Janitor: William Forest.

The business meetings of the board have been held regularly on the last Monday of each month; with the exception of February and March, during which time it was impossible to have a quorum because of the illness among the members of the board.

Its members have worked together in perfect harmony, with a view always to making the most of the facilities under their control, having always in mind the greatest good to the greatest number. That their efforts have not been in vain is shown by the increase in circulation of books from 1315 in May of 1912 to 2101 in January, 1913, and by the increase from 1073 readers in May of 1912 to 1463 in March, 1913. Slowly but surely the library is coming to that place in the favor of the community which it should occupy.

There have been about 500 books added to the library during the past year by purchase and gift, and the library now includes books on almost every subject.

A very commendable interest in the library has been shown by the Woman's Progressive league, in re-decorating the auditorium of the library. The ladies have made this improvement which has been completed with the exception of the vestibule, entirely at their own expense. It is indeed encouraging to the board to have such an interest taken in the library by the citizens, as is shown by this effort on the part of the Woman's Progressive league and by the donation of some 80 books by a dozen or more citizens this year.

The library board has had the platform in the auditorium lowered from a height of three feet to one foot, which is more in keeping with the height of the auditorium, and thereby has improved its appearance materially.

This report would not in any sense be complete if it failed to mention, that in the death of Eugene C. Dana, the board has suffered the loss of one of its best members. The library and its welfare were not by any means among the least of Mr. Dana's efforts toward the betterment of mankind. He was always ready and willing to do the thing at hand, and few were better versed in late literature of its merits than Mr. Dana. It would be well if all our municipal enterprises could be placed in the hands of men who would be as conscientious as Mr. Dana.
