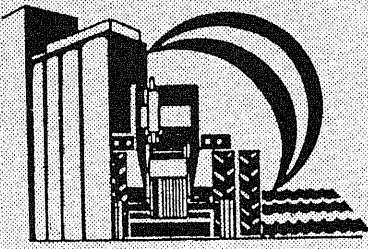

# 3 Lakers lead '87 Thumb B Academic Team

Three Elkton - Pigeon - Bay Port "Laker" High School students have placed in the top eight positions of the Thumb B All-Conference Academic Team, as announced jointly today by the eight member schools.

Robert Bannick, Christy Licht and Kathy Clabuesch represent the Laker High Class of 1987 in listing on the area-wide scholars' squad. They were chosen in calculations recognizing grade-point average, ACT testing figures and a scoring system patterned after the state-wide one used by the Detroit Free Press in choosing Michigan's top academic scholars each year.

In all, 40 top local students were chosen for First Team, Second Team and Honorable Mention categories. The area-wide listing precedes the naming of most valedictorians, salutatorians, class leaders, scholarship winners and other recognition.

This is the second year high school principals and other school officials from the eight Thumb B Association school districts have chosen top scholars, as a way of recognizing outstanding academic performance.

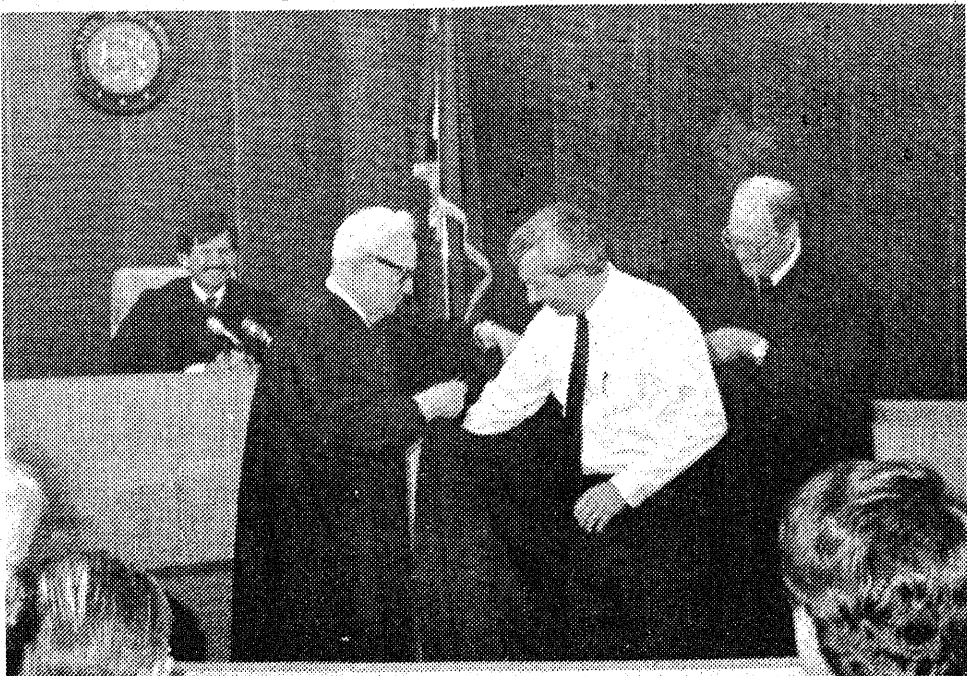

About 70 friends, fellow lawyers and family members attended the brief ceremonies in Judge Knoblock's Courtroom -- where photos were allowed in temporary suspension of state judicial rules.

Judge MacCallum served on the bench for 34 years prior to his retirement April 1. He first assumed the post Jan. 1, 1953.

Judge Clabuesch, 37, noted his priorities will be to attempt continuing the excellent reputation and performance of Judge MacCallum, and said he wants to safeguard Huron County's most important resource -- our future leaders.

Wilson Wu, a senior at Bad Axe High School, is the son of Dr. Charles and Anne Wu.

A student with a 4.0 grade point average, Wu has also cultivated extra-curricular interests including athletics, band, drama, debate and has won numerous academic awards. A member of the National Honor Society, Wu was also a member of Medical Explorers, Society of Distinguished High School Students, was a National Merit Scholarship Commended Student, mentor at the Intermediate School in

French and won plaques in Biology, Chemistry, English II and III, American Government, American History, debate, typing and mathematics.

He attended Summer Institutes at Purdue University, Duke University, Northwestern University, University of Iowa, Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp, All-State Intermediate Band at Interlochen and University of Michigan High School Debate Institute.

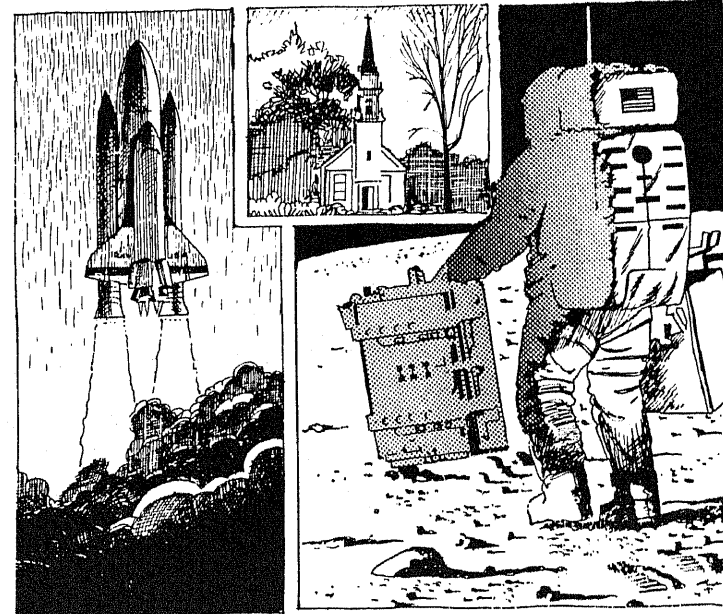

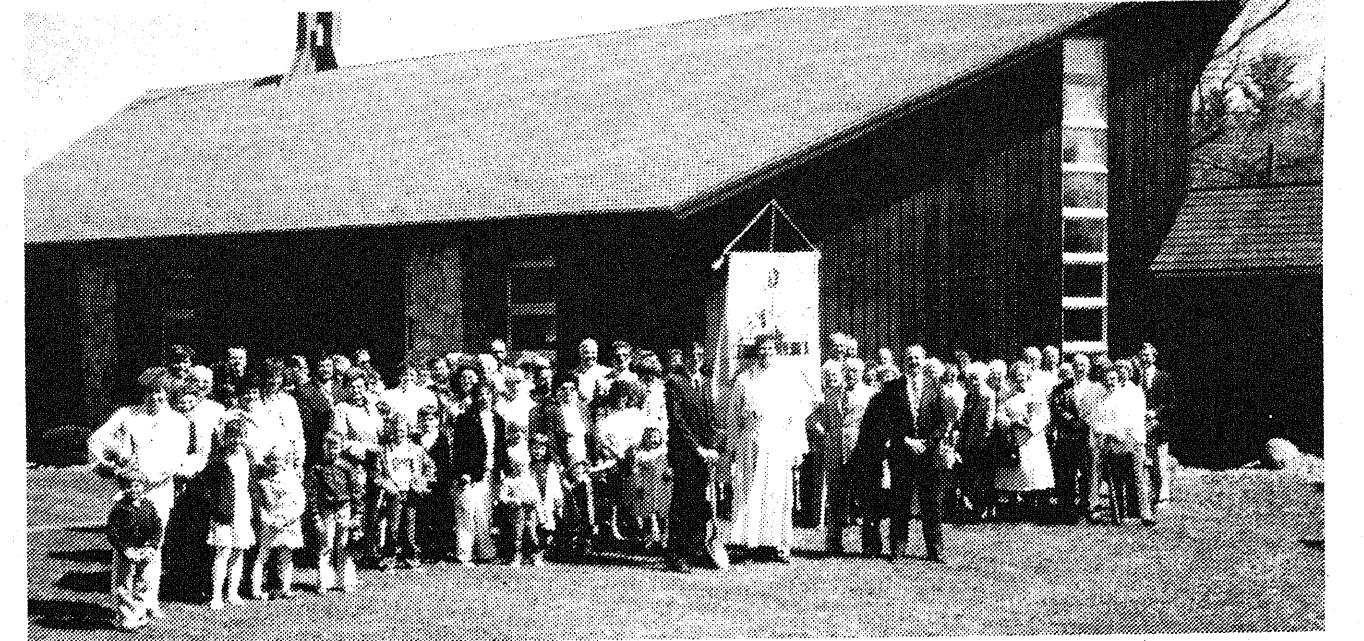

Into the hands of this kind of woman God entrusted the earthly care of His son Jesus.

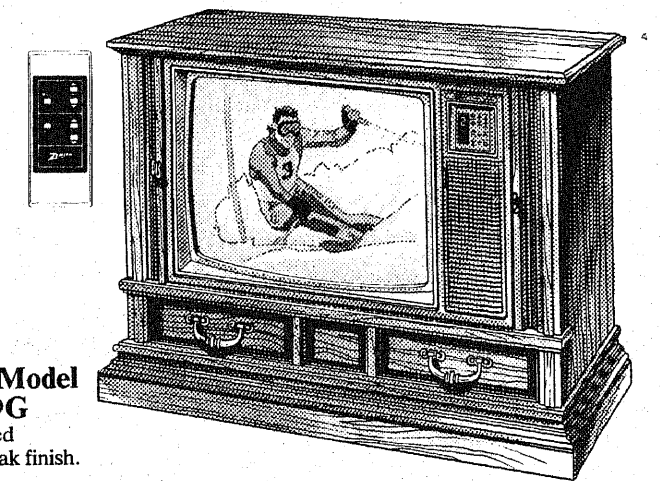
The mark that mothers leave on their children cannot be eradicated. Those who have good mothers have reason to rise up and call them blessed.

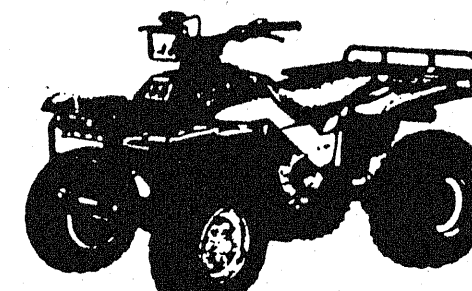

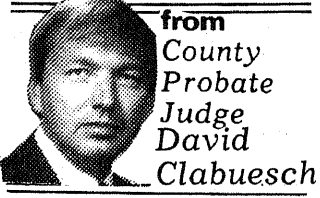
