

Three members were to be elected to the Board of Directors of the Sebewaing Beet Growers Association, Inc., at the annual meeting planned Tuesday at the Colony House, near Bay City. Three incumbents and two newcomers were seeking the seats, to fill the expired terms for representatives of Section 1 (Akron, Columbia, Elmwood, Wisner and Fairgrove), Section 2 (Sebewaing, Brookfield, Sheridan and Grant) and Section 3 (Fair Haven, Winsor, McKinley, Oliver, chandler, Caseville, Lake and Colfax).

The three incumbents and challengers, if any, are: Section 1 incumbent Lavern Engelhard and challenger Kurt Ewald; Section 2 incumbent Stanley Gettel, and Section 3 newcomers Dale Henne and Dennis Fritz. They are seeking the seat now held by Richard Strieter, who is not seeking re-election.


