Members of Bay Port RLDS and Cross Lutheran Churches will furnish refreshments for the social time following the program.

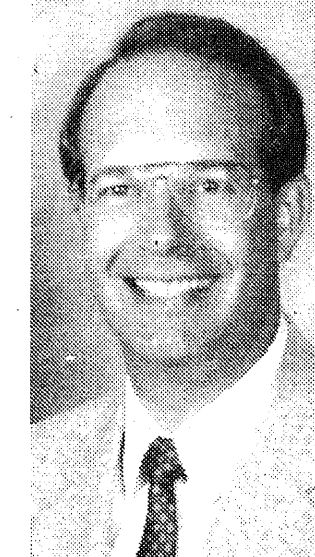
