New 4-team sports league coming to Thumb

After over two decades of membership in the Thumb B Association, the Elkton-Pigeon-Bay Port "Laker" School District will be leaving at the end of the 1990-91 school year. The Laker District will join current TBA Class C members Marlette, Cass City and Bad Axe in a new four-team league, after approval for the move came from school boards at each

of the four districts last week.

According to Laker Supt. Bob Drury, the pull-out and the formation of the new league was about the only option left to the district after being denied entrance into the expanding Thumb C Conference.

Caro, Millington and Vassar, also members of the TBA but Class B-size schools, have been invited to join the Tri-Valley Conference. Their departure would leave only North Branch, Cass City and Lakers in the TBA. **Bad Axe and Mariette** had been invited to join the Thumb C Conference, but their boards of education voted not to join.

"About the only option left was to join the Tri-Valley Conference, which would mean competing with Bullock Creek, Merrill and Carrollton" in the Saginaw Area, Drury noted.

"Our board of education was very involved with the other boards of education. They're making a decision that is good for boys and girls instead of decisions that some other school boards made on situations that supposedly happened nine years ago," Drury said.

"We've had an excellent spirit of cooperation."


The four schools also wanted to cut down on travel time to games, and to compete with schools of similar size.

Drury also said the four schools in the as-yet unnamed league would be continuing talks with the Thumb C league about a possible two-division conference.

The two divisions champions would play each other for a conference championship. "Our main objective is to merge with the Thumb C," Drury said.

A four-team league would possibly mean that each team would play other league members twice each year in football and four times each season in basketball.

Non-league games would be played with members of the TCC, as has been the practice in previous years. The four-team league would also allow league competition in wrestling, golf, and tennis, which most Thumb C schools don't
