Mitchell weighed 8 lbs. 4 oz. and measured 21 inches long.

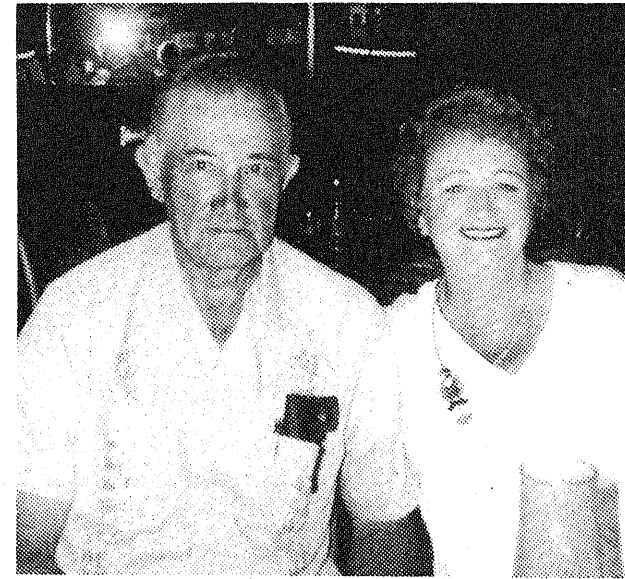

Here is a Halloween song you may wish to help your children sing for the up and coming Halloween night.

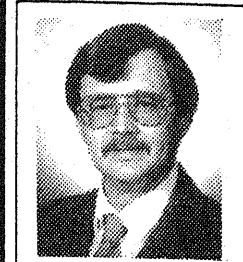
The Twelve Days of Halloween (sung to the tune of The Twelve Days of Christmas)

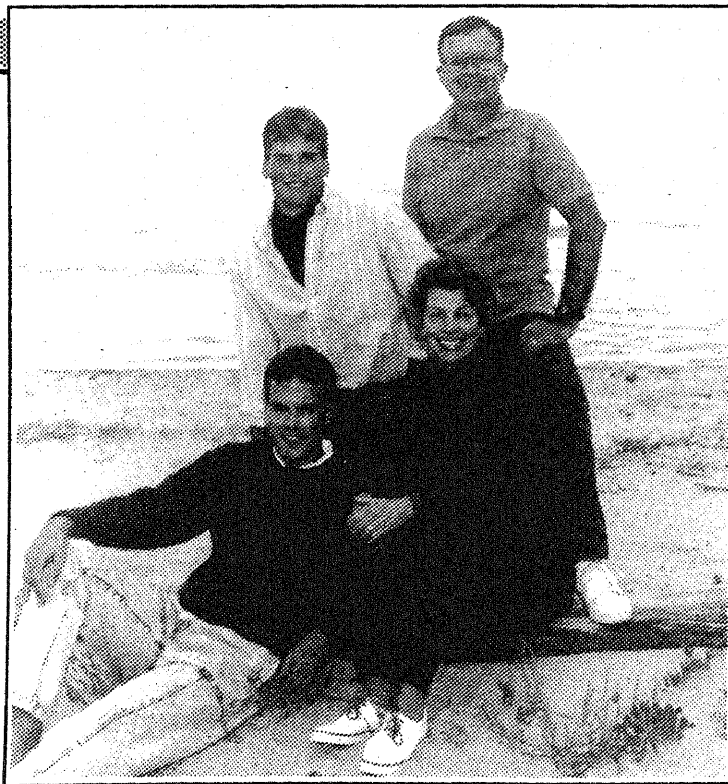
