### Thumb transpo study done

Findings of a regional transportation need's study of the Thumb are completed and public copies are now available. Ecosometrics of Maryland will present the Thumb Regional Transportation report this Wednesday, Nov. 3 in a 7 p.m. meeting at the Franklin Inn, Bad Axe.

The study examined the potential needs for transportation in Huron, Tuscola, Sanilac and Lapeer Counties, and the need to transport people to Bay City, Saginaw, Lapeer and Port Huron.

"State and federal officials are looking more and more to regional transportation systems," said Jennifer Leitzel, manager of Tuscola County's Thumbbody Express. "Regional transportation is an important element in the future growth of the Thumb, and we need access to medical technology and employment opportunities available in surrounding cities. We are so limited here in the Thumb."

Huron, Sanilac and Lapeer Counties have county-wide service. Tuscola County offers bus service in the Caro Area. "When area residents need medical services outside of the area all we can do is sympathize with them because our transit systems can't leave their designated areas," said Leitzel.

The year-long study was funded by a grant from the state Department of Transportation. — By MARY DRIER

### Facing shotgun charges

Richard D. Werschky, 27 of Sebawaing, has been charged with threatening a man with a shotgun last Tuesday, Oct. 27, at the Michigan Sugar Co. Plant in Sebawaing.

Werschky is charged with assault with a dangerous weapon and possession of a firearm during a felony in Huron County District Court. The assault charge is a felony with a maximum sentence of four years and/or \$2,000 fine.

The firearms charge is a felony with a mandatory sentence of two years to be served consecutively.

### Unionville house totaled

Six Thumb Area fire departments responded to a fire Saturday afternoon that totally destroyed a rural home.

The Unionville Fire Department was dispatched about 3:30 p.m. to a fire at the Rick Wolf residence, 2251 E. Cass City Road. Departments from Gagetown, Akron, Fairgrove, Sebawaing and Cass City assisted and were on the scene about five hours.

The fire started in a bathroom closet and appears electrical in nature, said Unionville Fire Chief Raymond Strieter. The house was a total loss, but it was insured. No dollar figure of damages is available.

### Bomb suspects caught

Huron County police agencies have four suspects in several bomb threats phoned to area schools last week.

Sebawaing Fire Department was one of several units to respond to phoned-in threats Oct. 22 to three school districts. Similar incidents were reported in neighboring schools of Laker and Owendale Gagetown Districts.

James E. Smith, 18 of Sebawaing, is scheduled for a preliminary examination 8:30 a.m. Thursday, Nov. 18, in Huron County District Court. Also, youths ages 11, 14 and 15

## Re-enactors perform in 'Gettysburg'

Nearly everyone dreams of being in the movies, even in a small part, but few of us realize that dream.

The dream came true for local Civil War buffs Jon Frazho and Will Eichler, who appear in the new movie "Gettysburg," produced by television mogul Ted Turner.

The movie is now showing in theaters throughout the country and critics have raved about it.

"Gettysburg" depicts the epoch battle between Union and Confederate forces in 1863 in Gettysburg, Pa., one which proved to be a turning point in the only war fought on American soil. More than

53,000 casualties were reported from the battle, making it the costliest conflict ever inflicted in this country.

Thousands of extras were needed to film the movie, and Bay Port resident Frazho and Pigeon resident Eichler were among the volunteers who answered the call to re-enact Pickett's Charge.

Both have plenty of experience in re-enacting that period of American history, as they are members of the Cumberland Guard, based in Lansing.

But movie-making is a different process than they thought it would be, Eichler said.

During a week of filming in August 1992, the two endured long waits and sweltering heat in their wool uniforms. The movie took 10 weeks to film.

"They didn't understand how military re-enactors operate," Eichler said. "They gave us too much time."

"They'd come to get us for breakfast and we'd be dressed and have our food eaten in 15 minutes, and they gave us an hour and a half for that. We sat there and waited and waited."

More than 100 re-enactors from Michigan took part in the movie, joining hundreds of others from across the country in helping make the

movie as authentic as possible.

"I did it for the experience and the chance to be a part of something that is good history," Eichler said.

Frazho said he thought the experience would be fun, but "I wanted to do it not so much to see myself in a movie but so I could educate other people that don't know much about the Civil War."

Both have been dedicated Civil War re-enactors for several years, taking part in encampments all over the state.

And over the years, they've collected an impressive array of equipment used to make the encampments as realistic as possible.

And because re-enactors want their equipment to be as close to the original as possible, Turner especially wanted volunteers with their own equipment.

"They saved a lot of money on props because we brought our own, which was more authentic anyway," Eichler said.

The movie was originally titled "Killer Angels," Eichler said, but Turner changed it, not wanting moviegoers to believe the film was about the Hell's Angels bikers.

### USA Drama Club prepares Christmas play

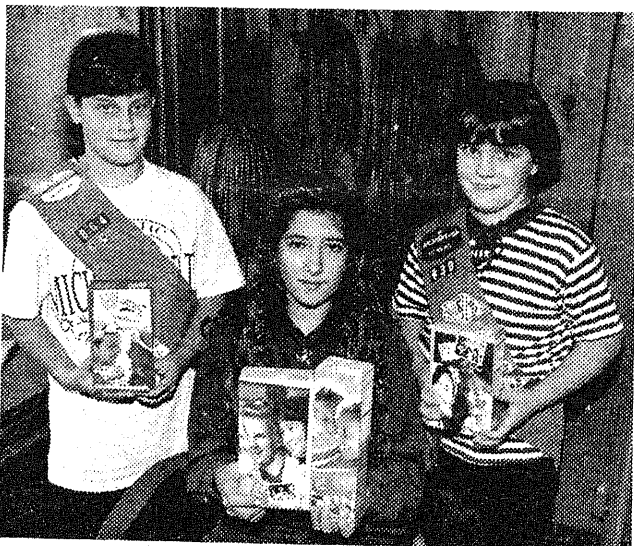
The USA Drama Club is preparing a one-act play for presentation to organizations at Christmas time.

## Michigan Sugar's Flegenheimer to retire

Michigan Sugar Company's President and Chief Executive Officer Ernest Flegenheimer will retire his post at the end of the 1993, according to a company announcement Thursday.

He will continue in his position as director of Michigan Sugar Co. and its parent company, Savannah Foods & Industries, Inc., of Savannah, GA.

Flegenheimer is well-known in the Thumb and throughout the company's four factory districts. He has regularly attended grower meetings and many events in the area that are connected with the beet growing and processing industries.

Flegenheimer was elected president of Michigan Sugar on Aug. 1, 1963, and CEO in 1970, when his father, Albert Flegenheimer, became honorary chairman. He served as company president for the past 30 years, longer than any predecessor in the

company's 87-year history.

"I've enjoyed all my years with Michigan Sugar, and am gratified with the progress the company has made," Flegenheimer said.

Michigan Sugar sales and production increased dramatically under the Flegenheimer leadership.

In his first year, the company produced 160 million pounds of sugar from about 50,000 acres of beets, and sales totaled \$21 million.

This year the company is expected to produce nearly 500 million pounds of sugar from 111,000 acres of beets, with sales of \$175 million.

In 1985 the company purchased Great Lakes Sugar Company of Fremont, OH, which produced an additional 100 million pounds of sugar last year. He also serves

as president and CEO of that company.

Michigan Sugar merged with Savannah Foods & Industries, Inc., in 1984, and Flegenheimer was elected senior vice-president and director of Savannah Foods. That company is the country's second largest sugar company with fiscal 1993 sales of more than \$1 billion.

Savannah Foods' chairman and CEO, W. W. Sprague, Jr., said, "We are losing one of the outstanding men in the sugar business, a man who is the outstanding leader in the beet sugar industry."

Before moving to Michigan, Flegenheimer was vice-president of Menominee Sugar Company of Green Bay, WI. His career in the sugar industry began six decades ago in the importing and exporting of sugar by-products, which was a family business.

Professionally, Flegenheimer is a trustee of the U.S. Beet Sugar Association and a director of The Sugar Association, both of Washington.

DC. He was president of Farmers and Manufacturers Beet Sugar Association, Saginaw, from 1965-1973.

He is adirector of Second National Bank of Saginaw and its senior director in years of service, having first been elected in 1964. Flegenheimer also served on boards of American Mutual Insurance Companies of Wakefield, MA, Saginaw General Hospital, United Way of Saginaw, the Saginaw Symphony and Junior Achievement.

Michigan Sugar's board of directors is expected to elect a new president at its December board meeting.

Michigan Sugar operates four sugar processing facilities—Sebewaing, Caro, Carrollton and Crosswell. The subsidiary, Great Lakes Sugar, operates two facilities in Fremont and Findlay, OH.

Their sugar is marketed under the Pioneer, Peninsular and Great Lakes brand labels, and numerous private labels.

## Caseville Historical Society moves ahead

If anyone wants to know what kind of projects the Caseville Historical Society is becoming involved in, all they need to do is look at their newly-designed logo.

Pictured on the logo is a sketch of the Crawford House, the first major project the local historians have become involved with since the group's beginning last spring.

The historic house was facing an uncertain future until its owners, Caseville Resort, Inc. donated the building to the Caseville Historical Society by letter last week.

Because of the group's desire to save the house from demolition as Caseville Resort owners take on a new partner—Young's Environmental, Inc. of Flint —to develop a condominium resort project on the property where the house now stands, the Historical Society didn't have to look far to find a historic preservation project to tackle.

Now the Caseville Historical Society has to find a location for its "gift," hoping to get a "green light" from the Huron County Road Commission to place the house on a portion of Caseville County Park property in the



Village of Caseville.

They will meet with officials from the Road Commission this Wednesday, according to Historical Society President Tom Shedd.

Funding for the project is in process too, as the Village of Council has signed a letter from intent to apply for a block grant for this historic preservation project, totalling about \$750,000.

The new logo, which will be used for membership cards, letterhead and any official communication from the Historical Society, was designed by trustee Dennis Kilbourn, who chaired the logo committee. The design was approved at the October meeting of the Historical Society.

One thing that Historical Society members seem to all agree is that the Crawford House project is a much more challenging project than they

would have chosen to select for a first project. Having been "thrown the ball," so to speak, they've decided "to run with it," so they can be ready to proceed when necessary.

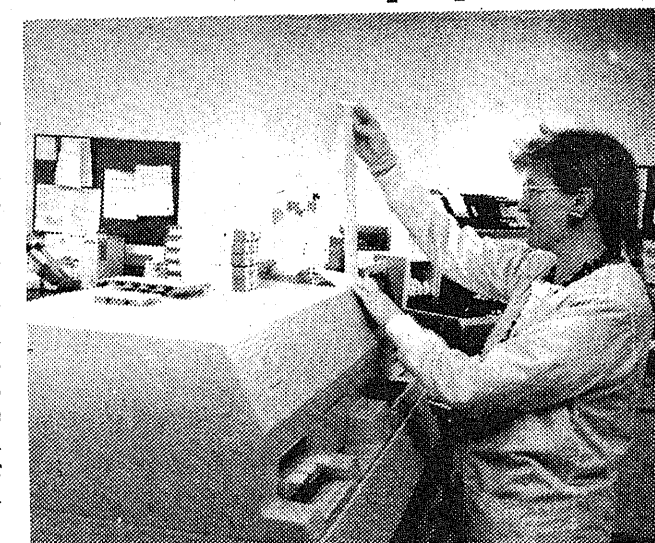
Even with the extensive publicity they've received because of this project, Caseville historians are eager for the public to know they still

have other projects to pursue.

They are looking for donations of historical artifacts to exhibit and of course, are looking for interested new members to join.

The Caseville Historical Society meets on the third Tuesday of every month at 7 p.m. at the Village/Township Hall.

## New test equipment



NEW TESTING EQUIPMENT in Scheurer Hospital's laboratory now allows Lab Manager Sue McFarland and her two technicians to run the department more efficiently. It allows certain tests to be done at the Scheurer lab instead of sending samples to an outside facility.

One new analyzer runs PSA tests, which checks for prostate cancer. The test has become routine for most men over age 50.

And the second new analyzer has the capability to run several tests, including checking on the level of therapeutic drugs in the bloodstream, hormone and thyroid levels. Pending Federal Drug Administration approval, the machine can also be used to test for the AIDS virus.

The new machines allow lab results to be reported to doctors a bit more quickly, but the biggest advantage is in better communication with doctors, McFarland said. "If a test needs to be re-run, the doctor can call up and we can do it right away," she said.

## Pigeon man sentenced

A Pigeon man who was convicted of third degree criminal sexual conduct was sentenced to up to 15 years in prison last week.

Elwood Smith, 46, a former Huron County Deputy Sheriff, was sentenced by Sanilac County Circuit Court Judge Donald Teeple to three to 15 years in prison on the charge, with 82 days already served credited towards the sentence. Smith will most likely serve his sentence in federal prison, officials say.

The charge stemmed from incidents occurring between 1979 and 1986 with a female victim who was under age 13 at the time. All occurred when Smith was off duty, reports say.

Smith pleaded no contest to the charge in September, after an investigation by the Sanilac County Sheriff's Department.

## Arson plea is entered

A 26-year-old Owendale woman will be sentenced Dec. 5, after pleading guilty to a charge of burning personal property, over \$50, involving a May 8 fire at Salem United Methodist Church, Pigeon.

Tina M. Miller pled guilty to the lesser charge in Huron County Circuit Court last week, after entering a no contest plea on the original charge of arson, involving the fire.

Pigeon Police and Michigan State Police from the Bad Axe Post investigated the fire, which was discovered at 8:41 p.m. when Pastor Steven Miller smelled smoke while working in his office. The suspect and the pastor are not related.

Police reports said the fire began in two spots in the church balcony when cloth church banners were lit. Pews were damaged, as was flooring plus heat damage in the balcony and smoke damage was caused throughout the building.

Total damage was estimated at \$50,000 and use of the church was restricted to the lower level for eight weeks. Reports showed this was the third fire at the church since 1988.

After recommendation by Consultant, a motion by Gehrs to proceed with the Water Tight Band and to offer a down payment of \$50,000, and spread the remaining cost over a 10 year period. Motion was supported by Licht. Motion Carried. The \$50,000 will be used from money previously set aside for sewer repairs. Motion to adjourn was offered by Eichler and supported by Pobanz. Motion Carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:30 P.M.

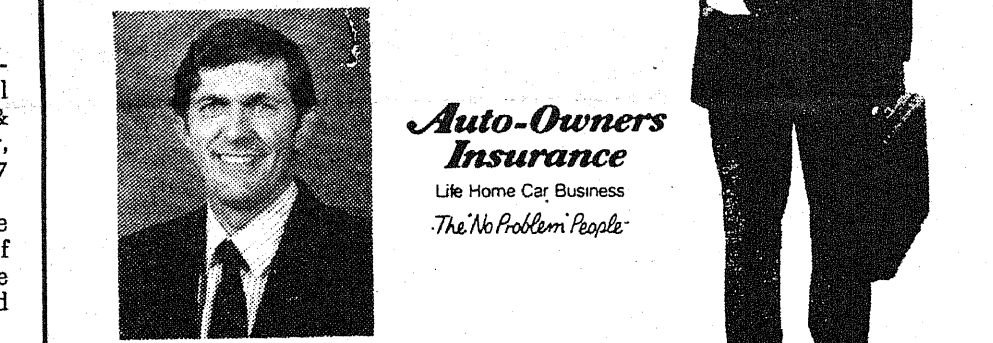

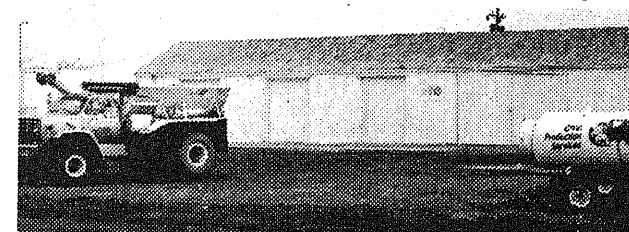

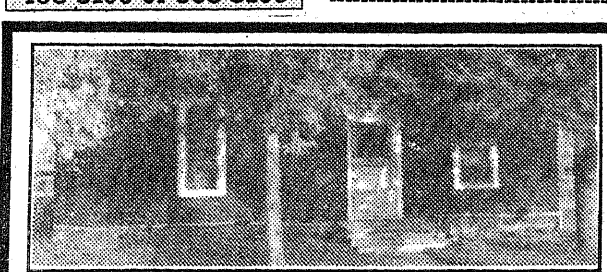
