 BISHOPSTOWN, D. C., Oct. 18.—A letter received here this morning states that Little Bull has made an application to surrender himself and band on the terms proposed to presidents some time ago, provided he be allowed to come into Fort Kough without a military escort or being subject to interference from the Indian agents. He desires to surrender to and treat with the military authorities. Only, His application has been forwarded to the president for decision. It is thought the president will conclude to let him sit tight in the matter in order to preserve the frontier settlements of the hourly of a raid by those Indians, especially as the Indians are ready to surrender on the first request.
