### The President's Relapse-More Sargi-cal Operations Performed.

There has been another gloomy season over the President's condition, and his state is still precarious, though his phy sicians hope he will pull through. Saturday morning he was attacked with a chill, followed by a high fever, his pulse rising to 180. The wound ceased to discharge freely, and it was found that a pus cavity was forming in the wound. The consulting physicians, Drs. Agnew of Philadel phis and Hamilton of New York were telegraphed for. Sunday morning an operation was performed by making an incident a few inches below the original wound, to make a new channel for the discharge of pus. A wide cut was made into the pus cavity which was reached at a depth of a little more than one inch. With the aid of a probe and a pair of forceps a small rubber drainage tube, perforsted with holes, was introduced into the wound made by the ball, and after being carried through the pus esvity was brought out through the new incision, one end of the tube projecting from the cut made by the surgeon's knife and the other from the mouth of the original wound.
