Robbery in the White Mountains. PORTLAND dispatches, Sept. 13, say: A family was robbed by highwaymen on the road from the Glen house to the Twin Mountain house near the line of the Portland and Ogdensburg railroad.

Tragedy in Kansas. The body of a man was found in a well near the town of Lawrence, Kan., on Sept. 15. The man was identified as John Smith, a well-known citizen of the town. The cause of his death is still unknown.

Man Who Shot at Guitzen. Sergeant Thomas Mason, of the 2nd Regiment of Cavalry, shot at a man named Guitzen on Sept. 15. Guitzen was shot in the arm and leg, and was taken to the hospital.

Land League Resolutions. The executive committee of the Land League will submit a report to the annual meeting of the League, to be held in London, on Sept. 25. The report will contain a full account of the work done by the League during the year.

An English sailing vessel was blown off the coast of France, and the crew were rescued. The vessel was the 'Hesperus', and it was carrying a large cargo of goods. The crew was rescued by a French fishing boat.

The Chinese have built a telegraph line between Shanghai and London, and are likely to engage in business with the West. The line is said to be the longest in the world, and it is expected that it will greatly increase trade between the two countries.
