



Between the day of the chodsing of Electors and the day on which they are to vote the title to the office of Elector of any person claiming to have been chosen shall be determined and certific i to the Executive of the State by such State authorities, ministerial or judicial, or in such manner as the State may prescribe by laws in force on the day of choosing the Elecfors, and every such determination shall be conclusive on questions of fact or of Statelaw in the counting by Congress. The bill then proceeds to make regulations for the meeting of the two Houses in joint convention, and provides that when any objection to any vote shall be submitted in writing and signed by at Teast one Senator and one member the two Houses shall separate and come to a decision thereon, which decision shall be announced to the joint convention, and no vote shall be received except by the affirmative votes of both houses. 


