THE FACTION FIGHT.

The condition of the Republican party to-day is one of the most remarkable spectacles in the history of politics. That of the Democratic party in 1860, preceding the great catastrophe which swept it from power, is more nearly a parallel than any other; but it is not a complete one. The difference between the two wings of the Democracy at that time was a difference of political principle in relation to the extension of slavery, while the present difference between the two wings of the Republican party relates only to the spoils of office and the ambitions of rival leaders.

The bill proposing to appropriate \$100,000 in the construction of new vessels for the United States navy is the subject of a bill which will probably be reported favorably by them. It deprives railroad of the right to remove suits against them from State to Federal courts in cases where the State in which they are technically resident. This bill is directly in the interest of poor citizens, who are often deprived of justice under the present law.

The story that he was in the bill back in the house is entirely devoid of truth.

There is a spirit of inquiry on foot which will break out in the shape of questions to the secretary of war, in regard to the money voted his department for mileage. The annual allowance of \$20,000 is all gone, and there is a demand for \$20,000 more. The secretary of war has been asked to keep things running until the matter can be liquidated. There is a belief on the part of several who have been hearing the matter that the \$20,000 was used in unauthorized payment of mileage to the Yerkton trip, for extensive traveling to and from Washington on "orders," when only "state orders" are to be served, etc.

There has been a great deal of speculation in the newspapers as to whether or not the Honorable Young and the Chinese mission, and as to whether he would accept the place or not. It seems that Mr. Young desired very much to go to Japan for literary reasons, and was not much inclined to go to China, where the field, from a literary standpoint, has been pretty thoroughly worked over, and where, especially under the new treaties, the labor would be so great as to practically preclude any time for literary matters. It may be definitely decided, however, at last, that Mr. Young will be offered the place, and that he will accept it.

An important meeting to further the Honorable Young's proposition was held at the Riggs house. Among those present were Vice-President David Davis, Secretary of War Lincoln, Representatives Henderson and Chalmers, Mr. Cutting, of Ottawa, and Mr. Morton, all of whom made speeches. Nearly every northern State was represented in the gathering. After a series of informal addresses a resolution was passed to organize a committee, which will be hereafter appointed, to take charge of the subject. While nothing was definitely decided upon, there was a useful interchange of views and suggestions were made which will bear fruit later on in the history of the canal.

The senate committee on pensions has appointed a sub-committee to confer with the assistant general and surgeon general of the army and the commissary general of purchases, with a view to recommending some method of expediting the adjudication of pension claims. The appropriations committee has completed the consular appropriation bill. Paraguay is consolidated with the mission to Brazil, and Uruguay with the Argentine republic. The consulate at Lisbon is abolished, and a new consulate at Antigua is established.
