THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED A RESOLUTION CREATING A SPECIAL COMMISSION OF THREE SENATORS TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGED REVENUE FRAUDS IN NORTH CAROLINA WITH POWER TO SIT DURING THE RECESS OF THE SENATE AND TO SEND FOR PERSONS AND PAPERS. It is alleged that revenue officers of North Carolina have engaged in frauds for election purposes and the revenue has been diverted from its proper channel. It is also charged that revenue officers are arranging to help along the anti-Democratic movement this year and the intended investigation may, so it is said, in some quarters break this up.

Congressman Thomas Allen, of Missouri, who died recently, was the richest member of the House, his fortune being estimated at three millions. He was a native of Pittsfield, Mass. He studied law, went to Washington, to publish the Missionist. At the next session of Congress he was elected Public Printer after a contest so acrimonious that when in April, 1840, his printing office was burned the fact was ascribed to political malignity. In 1842 he removed to St. Louis, and was intimately connected with the development of Missouri's railroad system, having built the Missouri Pacific and begun the Southwestern, but it was as President of the Iron Mountain that he was best known. He took the first locomotive across the Mississippi in 1852. He was a Democrat in politics. His burial took place at Pittsfield.

Officers of the American electric light company of Boston make serious charge against Col. Fred. Grant and his brother, Jesse. They allege that stock to the amount of \$50,000 or more has been sold, of which no report has been made, and that the company is left in debt for \$15,000.

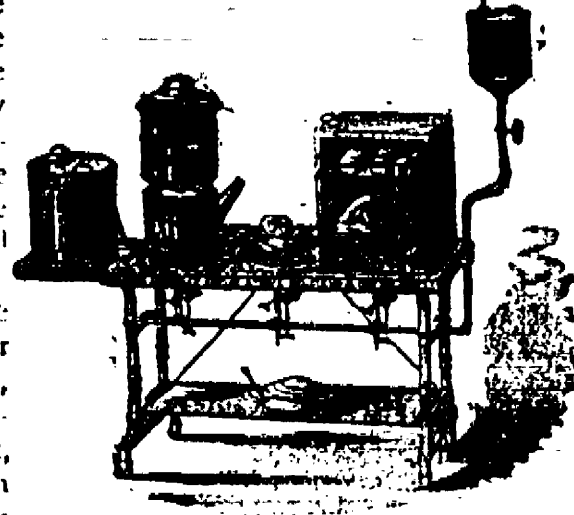
