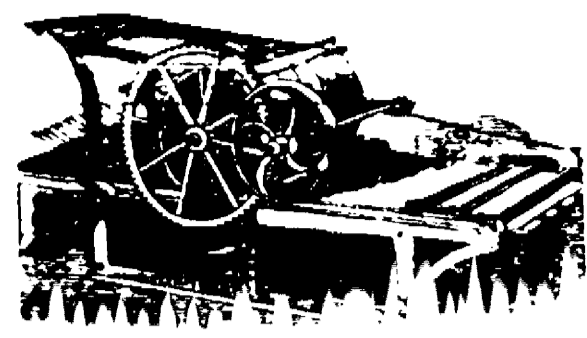

Ram four years old sheared 201 lbs., weight after shearing, 101 lbs. Three thoroughbred ewes eight years old sheared on an average 121 lbs. Grade rams: A three years old lamb sheared 164 lbs.; weight after shearing, 96 lbs.; a four years old ram sheared 231 lbs.; weight after shearing, 114 lbs.; 19 breeding ewes sheared an average of 11 lb. 9 oz.

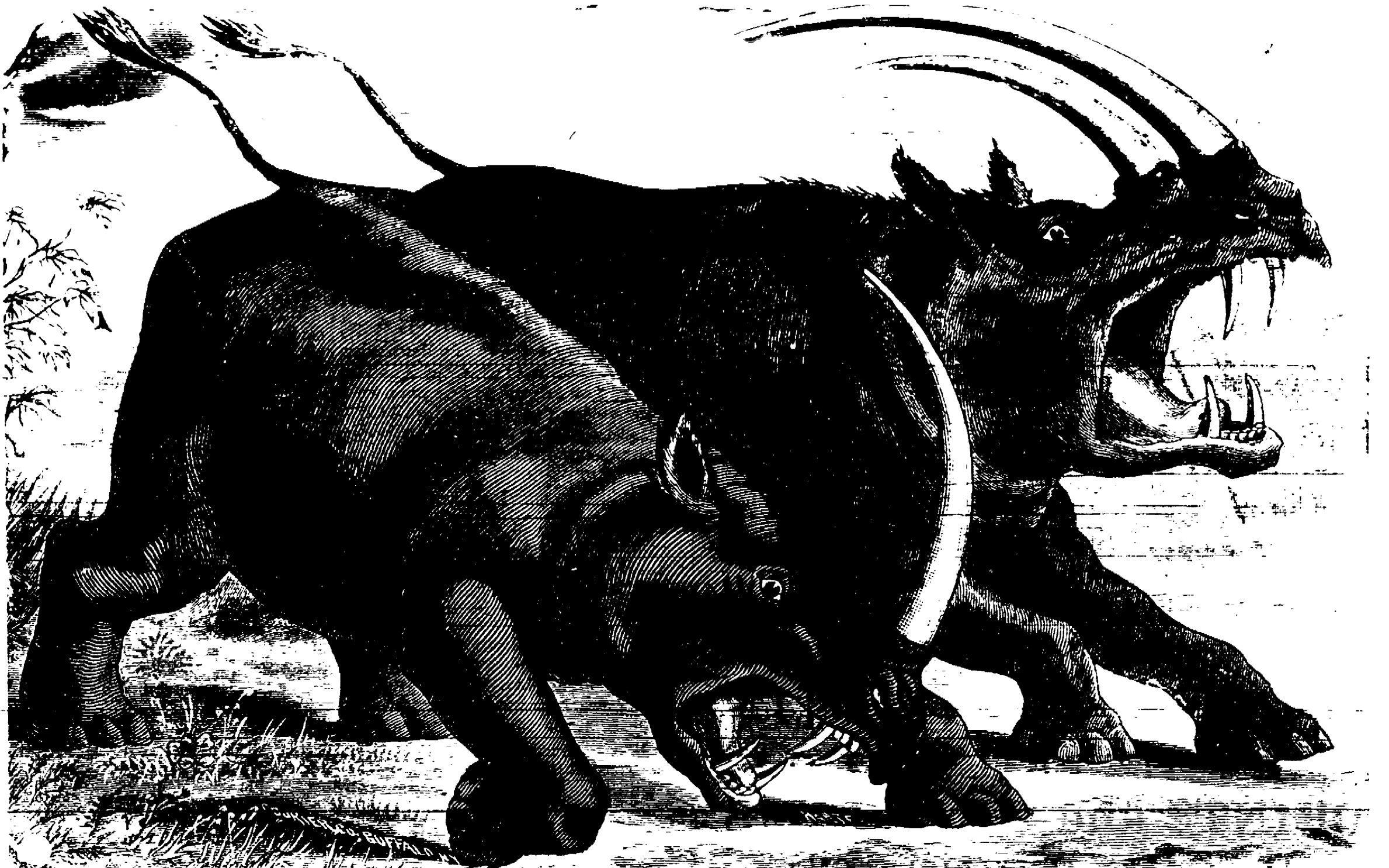

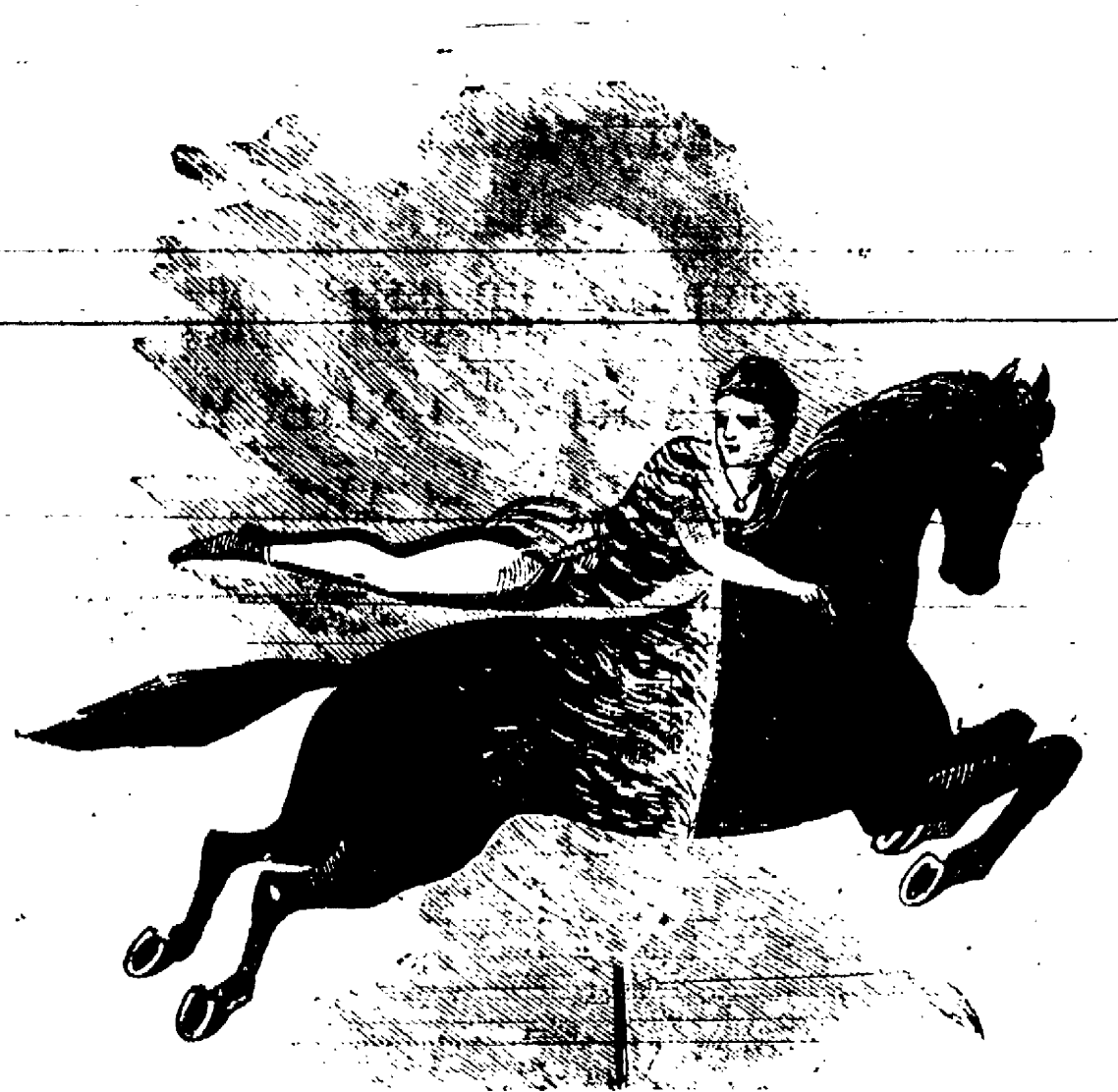

## DEATH OF AN OLD RESIDENT

**Emmanuel N. Young**, for forty years a resident of this county, formerly at Antrim and for the past thirty years in Owosso, died Saturday night, aged 80 years. Funeral services were held at the residence Monday afternoon, by Rev. Mr. Matrain, of the Episcopal church.

## Death of Judge Gould

**Dr. F. B. Smith**, in this city, Sunday afternoon, May 14, 1882. Hon. Amos Gould, aged 73 years, 5 months and 11 days. Although he had been in impaired health for several years, no symptoms of immediate danger were apparent until ten days ago, when his system yielded to the long-continued attacks of Bright's disease and he became prostrated.

**Judge Gould** was born in the town of Aurelius, Cayuga Co., N. Y., Dec. 3, 1808. He attended school at Auburn, near his native town, afterwards pursued his studies at the Aurora seminary, and entered the sophomore class of Hamilton College, at Clinton, N. Y. Later he entered the law office of Wm. H. Seward, in Auburn, as a student and subsequently became associated with Theodore Spencer, son of Chief Justice Spencer, of New York. In 1832 he was admitted to the bar of the Supreme Court and the Court of Chancery of New York. He was appointed Master in Chancery by his friend, Wm. H. Seward, then Governor of the State, and was later made Injunction-Master for the Seventh Judicial Circuit, the courts having been held at Auburn. These offices he held, at the same time maintaining an extensive law practice, until he removed to Owosso, in 1843, since which time he has been a resident of this city, for many years in active practice of law, a portion of the time in company with his brother, the late Col. E. Gould.

**In the fall of 1844 Mr. Gould** was elected Probate Judge for Shiawassee county, and in 1852 he was elected State Senator. He was also Prosecuting Attorney of the county, and Supervisor of the township of Owosso from 1844 to 1850. He was actively instrumental in obtaining the location of Owosso's two railroads—was the attorney for the Detroit & Milwaukee road during its construction, and was one of the original projectors of the Amboy, Lansing & Traverse Bay R. R., which resulted in giving us the Jackson, Lansing & Saginaw road. He was also deeply interested and for many years active in our school advancement, and was for a long time President of the School Board. He was the first Mayor of the city of Owosso. In legal ability he ranked among the best lawyers of the State.

**In 1865 he organized the First National Bank of Owosso** and from that time until his death was its President. He had other extensive property interests in Owosso and vicinity and also had immense investments in pine lands in northern Michigan.

**Judge Gould** was one of the founders of the Congregational Church in this city. He was present at the first meeting for its organization, in 1853, and at the adjourned meeting he was made chairman of the board of trustees, and held the position until his death. He united with the church by letter, on the 7th of April, 1867.

**Mr. Gould** was very happy in his family relations. He was a devoted, indulgent husband and father, and his leisure hours were spent in his home. He leaves a mourning wife and four children, viz: two daughters, Mrs. Morris Osburn and Mrs. E. R. Hutchins; and two sons, Fred H. and Lawrence P. Gould. The late Mrs. C. Y. Osburn was a well-beloved daughter, whose death was a severe affliction to him. The children of Mr. Gould were tenderly attached to him, and they mourn deeply a dearly beloved parent.

**Funeral services** take place this (Wednesday) afternoon, at 4 o'clock at the family residence, Rev. Mr. Platt, pastor of the Congregational Church, will officiate. The Common Council will attend in a body. They met last night and adopted resolutions of respect.

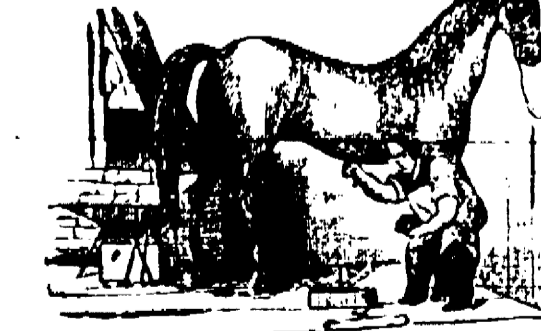

**The Situation in Ireland**  
 London, May 10. The appointment of George O'Donoghue as chief secretary for Ireland is received as substantial proof that the future course of the government in regard to Ireland will not be repudiatory, and that the temperate measures heretofore decided upon will be continued. The appointment is very satisfactory to the Irish members of parliament, who evidently feared that quite another kind of man would be put in the place. O'Donoghue has accepted the office, and a new election has been ordered for Harvick, the seat held by him. He is looked upon as an advanced liberal with strong sympathy for Ireland.

**TEMPERATE COURSE FAVORABLE**  
 Gladstone publishes a statement that among all the messages of sympathy and expressions of indignation at the recent assassinations, none are more remarkable for fervent sincerity than those received from Ireland. He has also written to the mayor of Cork declaring it to be his firm belief that there will be but one common sentiment in the entire kingdom regarding the assassination, and that Ireland in particular will demonstrate that she is free from the slightest moral complicity in the deed. These expressions and the moderate tone of the English press, excepting only the London Times, which is pursuing a sensational course and holding Parnell and the land league directly responsible for the crime, have given the Irish party and advanced liberals new heart, and hope that the promises of a swift and peaceful solution of the Irish question may be realized. The composure and restraint of the government and people under the trying circumstances of the situation is favorably commented upon by leading journals.

**DEVELOPMENTS IN THE CASE**  
 Two bicyclists who were in the park at the time of the assassination have appeared before the magistrates and testified that they passed the spot where the murders were committed. They saw the Lord Frederick Cavendish cry out, "Oh, you villain!" to his assailant, who then stabbed him again. Lord Frederick fell over against the bicycle of one of the fitters, who was coming to his assistance, but the murderers, with bloody knives, made towards him and both the bicyclists thereupon got away as fast as possible. They saw the car on the road awaiting the murderers. The driver's back was turned. They saw a man stab Cavendish in the back as he lay on the ground.

Scores of persons have been arrested on suspicion in various parts of Ireland, and in fact the police have orders to apprehend all persons who are at all suspicious and cannot give satisfactory accounts of themselves. A man with blood stains on his clothes has been arrested at Limerick. The stains were discovered while he was putting on a new suit in a store. A man who cannot give a satisfactory account of his whereabouts on Saturday, and who is believed to have driven the assassins to and from the scene, has been arrested in Dublin. Arrests have also been made at Kildare, Maynooth, Milford Haven, Chester, Castle Bellingham and Monaghan. As soon as the arrests are made the prisoners are hurried to Dublin for identification. In some cases the prisoners made a satisfactory showing and were discharged among them Charles Moore, the man first arrested.

**REWARD OFFERED**  
 The government will offer a reward of \$1000 for information given within three months which will lead to the conviction of the murderers, and \$1000 for private information. The government will also grant a free pardon and extend the special protection of the crown in any part of the queen's dominions to any persons other than the principals in the crime who may give the information required. Subscriptions to the reward fund in Cork already amount to \$2500, and large amounts will be raised in other cities.

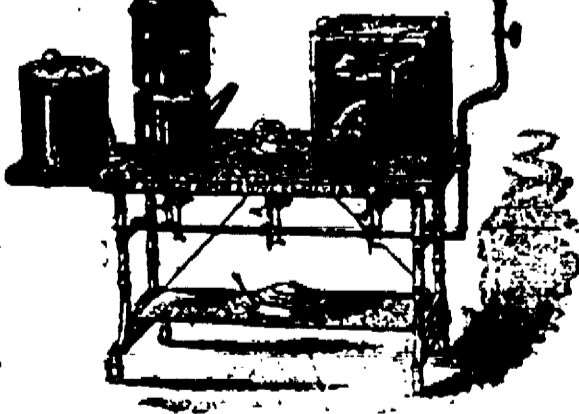
