Ail winter long the subject of compulsory retirement has been the uppermost topic in

army circles. In the navy compulsory retirement was established several years ago, and ft has worked admirably for the younger men. In the army promotion has been so slow that young men have grown old as second lieutenants, and many have gone out of the army the latter part of their life as mere captains. Then the slowness of the promotion has been greatly aggravated by bits of favoritism-promotion outside of all rule or right. Before Gen. Logan went away to Hot Springs, it was pretty evident that the compulsory retirement clause of the army appropriation bill would he insisted upon, and that some rule of equit able retirement would be adopted, so the injustice and favoritism governing promotions in the army should be abolished. Gen. Logan's absence from the city or some time gave the opponents of compulsory retirement quite an advantage. The friends of leading officers in the army subject to retirement have made a powerful canvass against the measure. They used such argument as these. They would say: "Why should not an officer be required to perform work so long as he is capable of doing it? The retired lists are aiready too large. Why should you put men capable of doing work in the position of drawing pay from the government, doing nothing, particularly when these men are more than willing to hold the positions they now occupy?" These arguments have had a great deal of weight. But since Gen. Logan's return therehas been a change in the situation.
