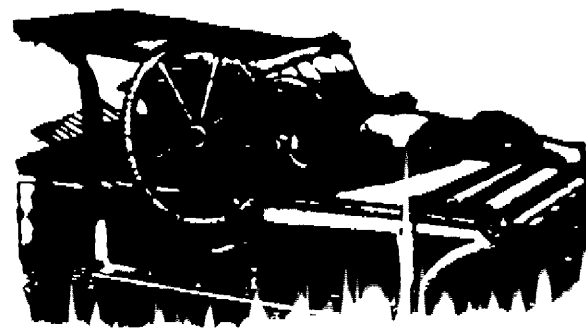

WASHINGTON NOTES.

The decrease in the public debt during June was \$11,500,000.

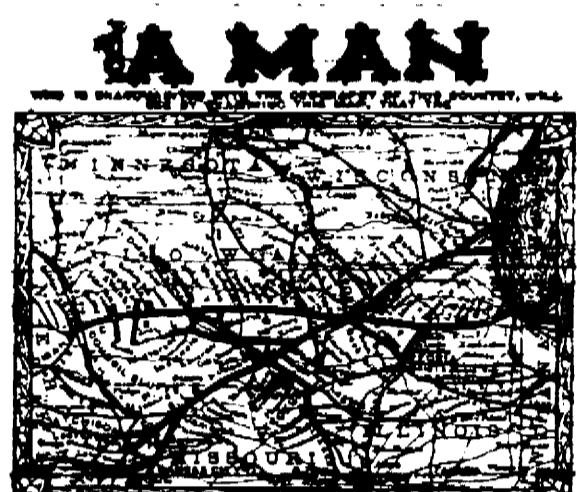

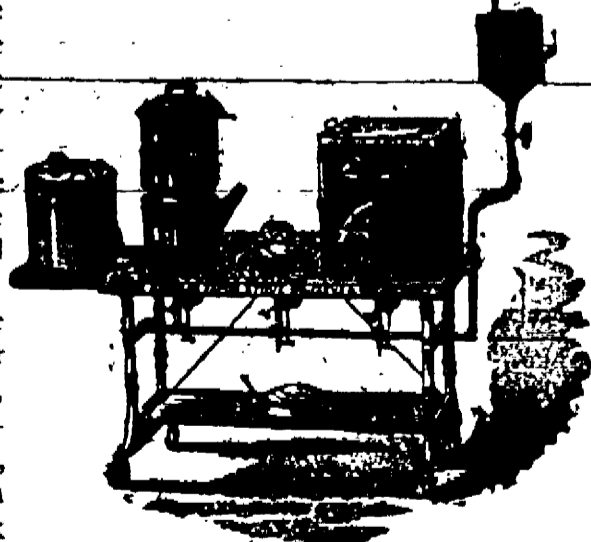

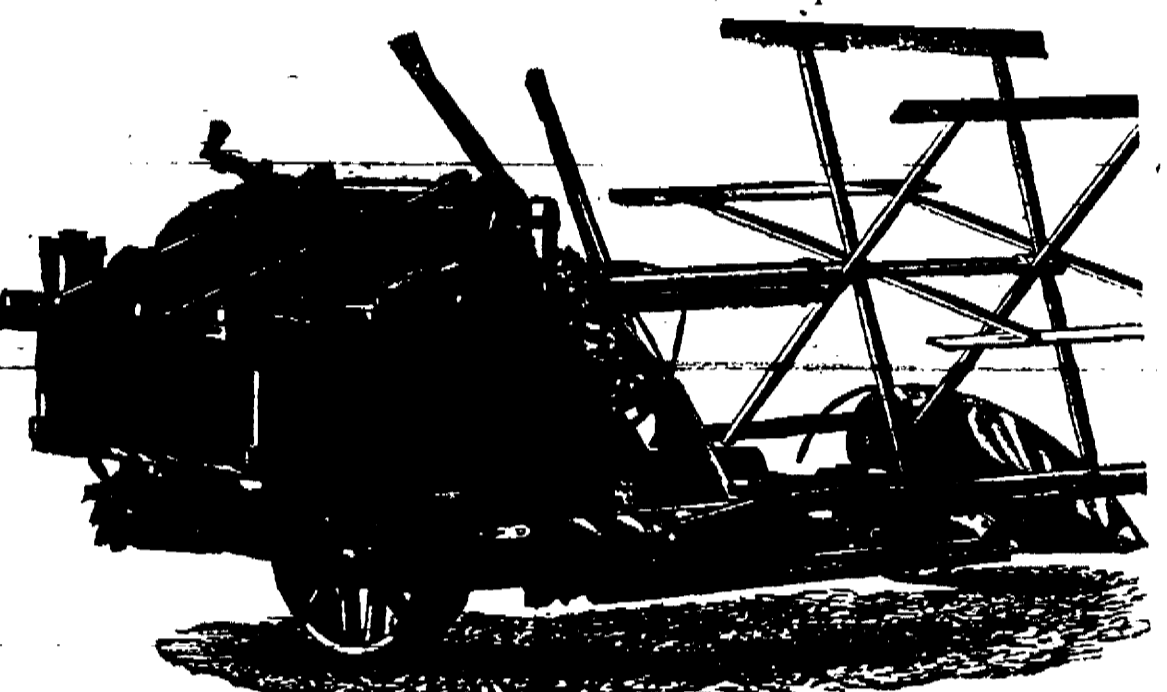
