Third Assistant Postmaster General Hazen has completed a statement of issues to postmasters by his office of postage stamps, stamped envelopes and postal cards, for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1882. The total number issued was 1.743,571,068 pieces, of the aggregate value of \$40,977,933; increase over the issue of the 15.7 per cent., equal in value to \$6,853,517. The appropriations for supplying these articles Thanking our patrons for past fav- amounted to \$1,038,000, or which \$878,836 was \$160,163, or 15.4 per cent. of the appropriations. Over 1,000,000,000 3-cent stamps and 350,000,000 postal eards were sold the past year. As a result of these figures, department officials feel warranted to asserting that, when the final statement of receipts and expendbe found the postal service is self-sustaining. Of the deficiency appropriation of \$2.162,36 made by congress last year to meet the expected deficiency in the postal revenues not one cent has been drawn from the treasury. This is the first year since 1851 in which the receipts of the postoffice department balanced its expenditures, with the exception of one June 30, 1883, an increase of 1,710 over 1881.

JUNE 27, -The house accepted from Messrs. Morse and Ranney a portrait of Hon. Robert C. Winthrop. In the Alabama contested election case of Strobach vs. Herbert, the former was granted leave to withdraw his papers: and in the case of Smith vs. Shelley, from the same state, the committee reported a resolution declaring the seat vacant. Mr. Page. as a question of privilege, explained how it hap pened that the bill passed to regulate immigration was not the one agreed to by the comclared that in handing the bill to Mr. Page he had no intention to deceive anybody. After a hot debate the error was corrected by the passage of the committee bill. The act to reduce internal revenuetaxation was then taken up. Mr. Springer moved to recommit the bill. with instructions to report a measure abolishing all internal revenue taxes, except those on bank circulation and distilled apirits. The motion was rejected by 58 to 125. Mr. Hewitt said the bill gave no relief to the great industrial interests of the country. Mr. Dunnell warned the republican side that the measure would not meet the approval of the people. "Ha! Well, madam, what have you Mr. Kelley expressed regret that the bill did not make a more sweeping reduction. The bill then passed by 127 to 80. > JUNE 28.-In the house, Mr. Orth reported a resolution, which was a lopted, requesting the president to state if any officers of the United States had made propositions to American citizens in British prisons to accept their release upon con litions. Mr. Robinson insisted that for one hundred days the president had been on his knees before Lord Granville, and gave notice that he would move to impeach Minister Lowell. The naval appropriation bill was taken up in committee of the whole, and Mr. Robeson reviewed its chief features. Mr. Whitthorne, after criticising the provisions of the bill, made the charge that Secretary Roteson squandered \$55,000,000 of navy funds during his administration. The committee rose, when a senate bill was passed appropriating \$20,0%) for a memorial column on the battle-field of Monmouth.

> JUNE 29.-The house passed a resolution to continue to July 15 all appropriations for necossary government service. "A bill was passed authorizing the construction of a bridge neross the Cumberland river near Nashvillo. The naval appropriation was considered in committee of the whole, Mr. Robeson explaining its provisions, but no action was taken. Mr. Dunnell reported a bill to tax the manufacture and sale of oleomargarine.

JUNE 30 .- In the house, the death of Mr. Hawk, or Illinois, was announced. A committee of three senators and seven representatives was provided for, to escort the remains to Monht Carroll, when the house ad-

snimous consent to report from the committee on ways and means a joint resolution acthorizing the secretary of the treasury to issue \$20),000,000 2 per cent. bonds, or cortificates, in exchange for bonds bearing the higher rate of interest. Mr. Hazeltine objected, but subsequently with rew the objection, and after some explanations by Mosses. Ketley and Ran dall the joint resolution passed. The house then went into committee on the naval appropriation bill. The senate bill to authoriz the construction of a bridge across the Stute Ste. Marie river passed. The bill to repeal so much of section 3,335 of the Revised Statutes as imposes a tax ou tobacco passed. The speaker laid before the house a message from the president, returning, without bisapproval, the bill to regulate the carriage of passengers by sea. Whan expressing his entire sympathy with the objects of the bill, he points out three sectous defects in it. The first is the use i of the words "uppermost decks," ignoring entirely all reference to the spar-deck, with which almost all large readers vessels are provided. The second is the requirement of seven clear feet height between deexs, and the third is the requirement of a list of passengers; being furnished before the vessel clears. This would be impracticable in the case of steamers, new passengers coming on board up to the last moment. The practical result of the law would be to subject all ocean steamers to great losses, and to restrict immigration. 
