CHAUTAUQUA, July 17. During a sad den equal-to-day rowboat containing Dr. A. B. King and wife of London, Ohio, Prof. Leland of St. Louis, and a young lady from London, was capsized opposite the assembly grounds. After an hour's struggle in the water, Prof. Leland and the young lady reached the shore, but Dr. King and wife were drowned. Mrs. King's body was soon recovered and a vain attempt was made at resuscitation. Mrs. King, who she formerly lived in Mansfield, and had been married less than a year.

CHICAGO, July 13.—Mrs. Seoville, when asked concerning the statement that the bouquet that she sent Guiteau on his last day in jail was poisoned, said, sarcastically: "Of course they found poison; it is just like them. Besides, they had to manufacture some story to excuse their brutality in excluding me from Charles's cell." She then denied point blank having put arsenic on the bouquet, and said she did not want Guiteau to escape the gallows by such means, and that he would not have taken the poison if he could. She expresses the intention of continuing the legal agitation over this matter until it is proved that an insane man was hanged.

Swindling Farmers.
The reports of farmers being swindled by traveling sharpers are less numerous than they were a few years ago. Farmers are not so anxious as they were of becoming agents for the sale of useless implements, or to purchase patent rights. They are more careful about signing orders for lightning-rod and other devices for the future. In brief, they are becoming more intelligent in all business matters. Cases of swindling are occasionally reported, but when they are it is evident that the sharpers have been obliged to resort to some new dodge in order to insure success. A new swindle, according to local reports, has been perpetrated in several places in Iowa, during the past month. It requires two persons to manage it successfully. They watch the papers for notices of strays. One goes to look at a horse or cow, and soon decides that it is not the one he has lost. During his visit he carefully notices the size, color, and peculiar marks on the animal, and forms a pretty accurate opinion in regard to its weight and age. He reports all these matters to his partner, who, in a few days, pays a visit to the farm where the animal was taken up. He is able to give so full and accurate a description of the "lost" animal that the person in whose possession it is has no reluctance in offering to give it up. The pretended owner, however, finds it inconvenient to take it home, and offers to sell it at a low price. The farmer accepts the proposition to sell, and pays over the money. In the course of a few days the rightful owner comes along and claims the animal, and produces evidence that it is his. The residence of the seller cannot be ascertained, and, of course, the buyer is out the money he has paid.

THE RUSSIAN APPLE

Report of Standing Committee on
Hardy Apples, both Native and
Foreign, of the Western New York
Horticultural Society. What they
Say About the Russian Apple.
The deep interest which has been felt
of late years in the production and in-
troduction of new and hardy apples, in-
duces us to give an extended notice of the
extraordinary success which has attend-
ed from the first introduction of them up
to the present time. They are entirely
hardy, bearing annually their crops of
delicious fruit, and are entirely free from
the insects so common to our native vari-
eties. The specimen trees in bearing
for the last ten years have never failed
to give a crop yearly. They are healthy
and vigorous growers, and are in some
respects much like our native crabs,
bearing in the nursery rows at three
and four years old; and we have no
hesitation in recommending them to all
persons in want of this, the standard of
fruits, the apple, and particularly where
our native varieties do not succeed as in
former years. As the forests become
cleared up the very soil and climate
change to some extent, and if we wish
to be successful in the growing of the
apple, we must accommodate ourselves
to the various changes. They are recom-
mended for the following reasons:
1st. They can be planted in any kind
of soil, and in the most exposed situa-
tions, with perfect safety.
2d. They will stand the severity of the
changes of our climate without the least
injury.
3d. They come into bearing very early,
often the second year from planting, and
bear every year.
4th. They give larger returns from the
number of trees, or space occupied, than
any other fruits in cultivation.
5th. They are especially suited to
those whose space for planting is limit-
ed, combining as they do summer, fall,
and winter varieties, and of the most ex-
cellent quality.
