

Mr. Cannon submitted a conference report on the legislative, judicial, and executive appropriation bill, agreeing to all the items except that for the transfer of records from the surgeon general's office to the adjutant general's archives, and a further conference was ordered. Bills were referred, to collect from the Kansas Pacific Railroad company the cost of surveying and conveying certain lands; to declare forfeit lands granted the Northern Pacific company and still remaining unpatented, and fixing the duty on imported hay at 20 per cent. ad valorem.
