





Colonel Corbin, Secretary of the Garfield Monument Association, has sent out the following circular: "The Society of the Army of the Camberland, through its Gar field Monument Committee, have deter mined to give, under provisions of a join resolution of Congress on Aug. 5, 1882, National tair and bazaar industrial and are exposition to be holden in the rotunda of the United States Capitol in the city of Washington, D. C., commencing on the 25th day of November, 1882, and to continue until the 2d day of December, 1882, its object being to raise the greatest possible amount of funds to aid in the erection of a statue at Washington to the memory and honor of the late President, James A. Gar field. The general plan of the project will be inaugurated and carried forward under the following management: A board of control, to consist of the Garfield Monument Committee of the Society of the Army of the Cumberland as now organized, and ganization: a board of direction, consisting of thirty, from which there shall be an executive committee of seven members, who shall have immediate control and direction of the fair during its organization and con tinuance, with power to determine and nominate the personnel of such sub-committees as may be required; a board of commissioners, to consist of six members from each State, three of whom shall be resident in the District of Columbia and three in each of their respective States, the three resident commissioners to constitute a quorum for the transaction State Commissioners to solicit exhibits and contributions from their several States and to invite and awaken a lively interest among their people in the success of the work, and to look after the interest and well-being of such of their constituents as may be interested. Timely arrangement will be made at general headquarters for the receiving and forwarding of such exhibitions as may be offered and when placed on exhibition will, excepting perishable articles, remain from the opening to the closing of the fair, and shall, when it is so desired, bear the name of the maker and in all cases will be disposed of by sale, or such other process as the judgment of the Board of Directors shall decide. for the benefit of the monument fund; a board of award, whose duty it shall be to examine and report upon the various exhibits, awarding inedals, and such honorable mention as in their judgment may be desired, and give suitable engraved certificates of the same, according to the rules and regulations adopted and observed at the Centennial Exhibition of 1876 at Philadelphia.


