A RUSH FOR THE THREE PER CENTS. At 12 o'clock Friday Secretary Folger took a sealed envelope from a heaping barrelful of similar packages, and a clerk a his elbow made a record of the bid it held: This proved to be the request of the Mechanics and Farmers bank, of Albany. N. Y., that bonds representing 85,000 in 314 old farmer was robbed of money with per cents be exchanged for bonds of like which he had intended to purchase a value bearing 3 per cent. interest. Secretary Folger smiled to see that his own state had won the first place in the lottery, and left the room to return to his office. The drawing, however, continued all day, and even when the 2,500 clerks were streaming from the treasury in all directions at the close of office hours, the officer in charge of he drawing was thrusting his wearied arm deep in the barrel, while the monotonous voices of the clerks and their busy pens told of progress in the work of record. There were two thousand envelopes in all. The clerks brought them into the room of the chief of the loan division of the treasury at 11 o'clock, and tried to stuff them into a large box that had been brought there for the purpose, but it proved insufficient and the floor was strewn with a litter representing tens of millions of dollars. The drawing was postponed therefore till a barrei could be brought. When one was obtained the envelopes were poured into it and then two clerks rolled it vigorously around the room. When the contents had been well shaken the recording clerks took their places and the lottery began. It was estimated that \$300,000,000 of the 3% per cent. bonds were surrendered in exchange for a corresponding amount of 3's. 




